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COLD STORAGE REPORT AS OF JANUARY 1, 1938

The Bureau of Agricultural Economics makes the following report based on data rnished by cold storage warehouses throughout the country. The report contains slocks on hand as of January 1, 1938, with comparisons, for the following groups of commodities: Fruits and Vegetables, Dairy and Poultry Products, and Meats (cured and frozen) and Lard. Special tables of cold storage holdings by States or geographic divisions of the country are included for cream, butter. American cheese, eggs, poultry, apples, and pears.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Apples held in cold storages, as reported to the Bureau of Agricultural Economic as of January 1, 1938, were the largest January holdings of record - 31,987,000 behals. They exceeded the previous record made January 1, 1932, by 1,858,000 bushels. C d storage holdings in western boxes, however, were approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ million boxes as than the record holdings of January 1, 1931.

Winter varieties of pears stored in boxes, while considerably in excess of the unary 1 holdings for the past 4 years, were 572.000 boxes below the record January 1 dings in 1931.

January 1 stocks of frozen and preserved fruits, including cold pack, amounted 123,131,000 pounds - approximately 31 million pounds in excess of the previous January 1 record holdings in 1932. Stocks of frozen vegetables began their seasonal at a finite storage reversely during the month of December

DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

Creamery butter holdings in cold storage on January 1, 1938, were 42,954,000 : pounds, which is 30 percent below the stocks of a year ago and 24 percent less than the 5-year (1933-37) average. The out-of-storage movement during December was somewhat less than for any year since 1932.

The January 1 stocks of American cheese were 7 percent less than a year ago but were 9 percent above the 5-year (1933-37) average stocks. Total holdings of all varieties of cheese in cold storage were 103,865,000 pounds, which was a decrease of 4,632,000 pounds from December 1, 1937. Stocks were 6,535,000 pounds less than a year ago but 9,294,000 pounds greater than the 5-year (1933-37) average.

The net out-of-storage movement of shell eggs during December 1937 was 1,841,000 cases. This was somewhat heavier than the average movement for this period.

Total holdings of frozen poultry were 123,320,000 pounds on January 1, which is 34 percent less than a year ago and 7 percent less than the 5-year (1933-37) average.

Turkey stocks on January 1 were approximately 10 million pounds less than a year ago but were about 5 million pounds above the 5-year average.

FROZEN AND CURED MEATS

(INCLUDING LARD)

Except for 1932 and 1933, the January 1 total stocks of frozen and cured beef were the lowest on record. They were only 31 percent of the stocks reported a year ago and 54 percent of average.

Total holdings of frozen and cured pork on January 1 were the second lowest on record for this date. The net into-storage increase during December was 92 million pounds compared with a similar movement a year ago of 203 million and the 5-year (1933-37) average movement of 116 million pounds.

Total frozen and cured meats in cold storage on January 1 continued at a low level - only slightly more than one-half the holdings of a year ago. They were 31 percent below the average holdings for this date.

The increase in stocks of lard during December were about normal for this period. Present stocks, however, were only 36 percent of stocks a year ago and 54 percent of the average.
