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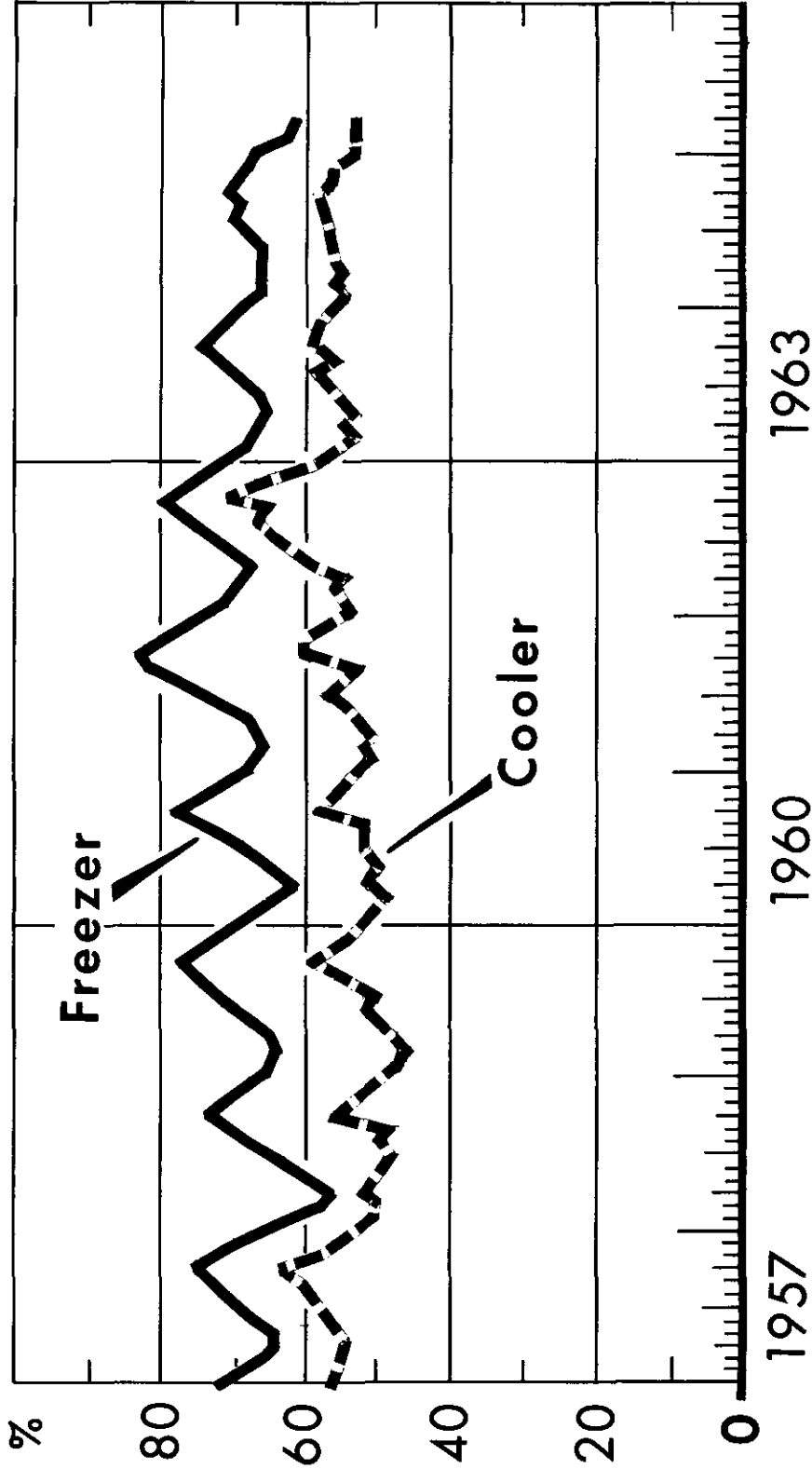

## COLD STORAGE REPORT, MAY 1, 1965

### Commodity Summary

May 1 supplies in the Nation's refrigerated warehouses totaled 5.2 billion pounds, down 340 million from April 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Cooler-held stocks were lowered to 1.9 billion pounds because of the seasonal downturn in stocks of fresh fruits and vegetables. Freezer-products, at 3.4 billion pounds, were 42 million pounds less than on April 1 after the withdrawals of eggs, poultry, fruits, vegetables, and beef.

Use of public cooler space was 53 percent of capacity, unchanged from a month earlier, but 1-point less than on May 1, 1964. Freezer occupancy of 61 percent on May 1, 1965 was the lowest for the date since 1958.

May 1 supplies of frozen orange concentrate reached a new high for the date after a record April gain of 15 million gallons brought stocks to 57 million gallons. On this date last year, 36 million gallons were in storage and the 1959-63 average stocks are 39 million gallons. An April net reduction of 103 million pounds in frozen vegetable stocks lowered the national inventory to 960 million pounds, 10 percent less than on May 1, 1964 but 19 percent more than average. Supplies of all vegetable packs were lowered during the month except asparagus and spinach. The sharp decline of french fries was largely responsible for a sharp drop in frozen vegetable supplies. Holdings of frozen fruit were 350 million pounds on May 1 compared with 248 million at this time last year and average stocks of 306 million pounds.

Poultry in storage amounted to 211 million pounds, down 40 million from April 1. Supplies on May 1 were 12 percent less than last year and 1 percent below average. Turkey holdings on May 1 were 15 percent under those of a year earlier and 6 percent under average.

Shell egg holdings moved up to 52 thousand cases but frozen egg stocks of 55 million pounds were about the same as a month earlier. However, holdings of frozen eggs were lower than both last year and average.

A seasonal buildup of 33 million pounds of butter raised warehouse stocks to 132 million pounds, and a 17-million pound gain in American cheese stocks brought total in storage to 269 million pounds. The April butter gain was considerably larger than last year and average, but stocks of 132 million pounds on May 1 were about one-third less than last year and average.

Holdings of meat dropped 13 million pounds during April, the result of a 28-million pound reduction in beef and pork, but was partially offset by a gain in canned meats. The total meat inventory on May 1 was 675 million pounds, down 22 percent from a year earlier but 9 percent more than average for the date.

### Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Warehouse stocks in cooler rooms totaled 1.9 billion pounds on May 1, down 298 million from a month earlier. Cooler stocks were smaller because of net withdrawals of fresh fruit, vegetables, nuts, canned milk, and pork. However, seasonal gains were reported for dried and evaporated fruits, cheese, eggs, beef, and canned meats. Total supplies in cooler rooms were 10 million pounds more than on May 1, 1964 and 271 million above average.

May 1 holdings in freezer rooms totaled 3.4 billion pounds, down slightly from the previous month. April reductions in stocks of eggs, poultry, fruits, vegetables and beef were larger than gains in stocks of cream, butter, juices and pork. Total May 1 stocks in freezers were 3 percent smaller than those of a year earlier but 13 percent larger than average.

### Storage Occupancy in Public Warehouses

Occupancy of public cooler space was unchanged from a month earlier and at 53 percent was down 1 point from May 1, 1964. A decrease of 4 points from a month earlier in the Pacific States was offset by increases in the East North Central, West North Central, South Atlantic and Mountain States. Minor decreases were reported in the Middle Atlantic, East South Central and West South Central States. Average cooler occupancy on May 1 is 52 percent.

Freezer occupancy declined 1 point to 61 percent, the lowest for May 1 since 1958. Occupancy at this time last year was 66 percent, average for the date. An increase of 1 point took place in the South Atlantic region but nearly all other regions showed a decrease from a month ago.

#### Dairy Products

May 1 creamery butter stocks were 132 million pounds, compared with 196 million pounds at this time last year and 199 million pounds, the average for the date. Government-owned stocks accounted for 81 million pounds of this year's May 1 total. Stocks of cream, at 9 million pounds, were about the same as May 1 a year ago but 6 percent less than average. American cheese stocks of 269 million were 15 million pounds less than on May 1 last year and 36 million pounds below average.

#### Juices, Vegetables, and Fruits

May 1 supplies of frozen orange concentrate were 57 million gallons, a record high for the date. The gain of 15 million gallons during April also was a new high for the month. Last year an increase of 7 million gallons brought supplies to 36 million on May 1, but average stocks for the date are 39 million gallons and the average April gain is 4 million gallons.

A sharp drop in french fried potato stocks lowered the frozen vegetable inventory to 103 million pounds to 960 million on May 1. Supplies were 10 percent below a year earlier but 19 percent above the May 1 average. Except for gains in frozen asparagus, and spinach, all items were reduced during April. The largest reduction was 39 million pounds of french fries which left 309 million in storage on May 1. Generally, at this time of year, french fry stocks increase. The advance during April 1964 was 37 million pounds and the average April increase is 11 million pounds.

Frozen fruits in storage on May 1 totaled 350 million pounds, down 59 million from a month earlier. Supplies of all the various fruit packs were lowered during April and the combined reduction was 9 million more than the April 1964 downturn and 5 million more than average. Supplies on hand were 41 percent above May 1 last year and 15 percent more than average.

#### Meat and Meat Products

Total stocks of beef, pork, and veal were lower on May 1 but holdings of lamb and mutton, canned hams and other canned meats moved upward. Total beef in storage was down to 218 million pounds after an April net withdrawal of 27 million pounds. Supplies were 17 percent less than on May 1, 1964 but 31 percent larger than average. Pork supplies totaled 334 million pounds, 1 million less than a month earlier. This downturn compared with a 62-million pound upturn during April 1964 and the average April rise of 39 million. Frozen pork stocks advanced 6 million pounds to 306 million pounds, 30 percent below May 1 a year ago but 2 percent above average. Cured pork stocks declined seasonally and at 28 million pounds compared with 38 million on May 1, 1964. Average May 1 stocks are 44 million pounds.

#### Poultry and Poultry Products

May 1 poultry supplies totaled 211 million pounds, 12 percent under a year earlier and 1 percent below average. Holdings of broilers at 23.8 million pounds were 9 percent higher than a month ago and 2 percent more than a year ago. Frozen turkey supplies were 104 million pounds, down 31 million pounds from April 1 and 18 million pounds from May 1 last year.

Shell egg holdings on May 1 at 52 thousand cases were 14 thousand more than on April 1 but 29 thousand less than at this time a year ago. Frozen egg holdings at 55 million pounds were slightly less than a month earlier and 11 percent below May 1 a year ago.
