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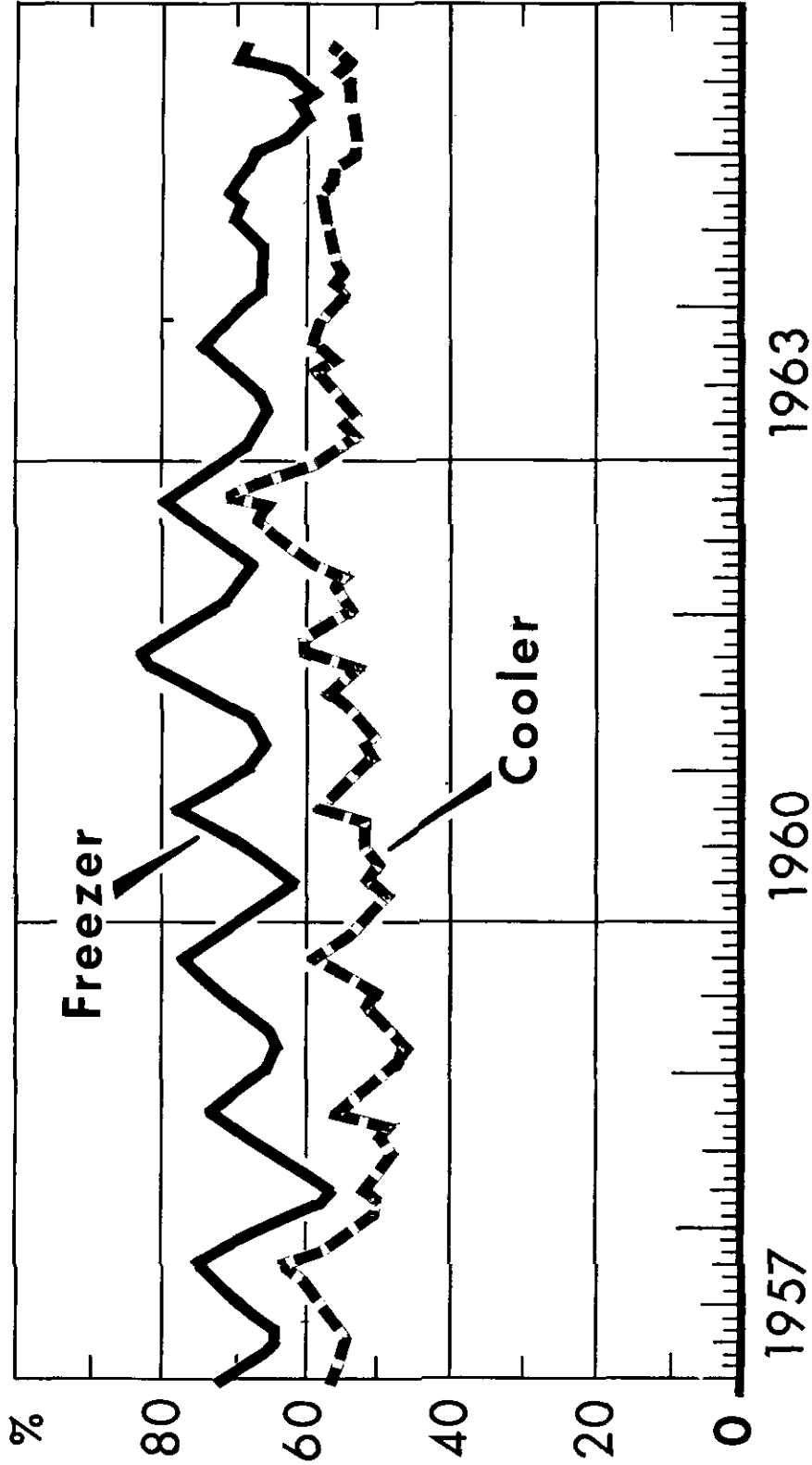

COLD STORAGE REPORT, NOVEMBER 1, 1965

Commodity Summary

November 1 holdings of frozen turkeys were 365 million pounds, up 123 million from October 1, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Stocks were 23 million pounds larger than at this time last year and 48 million more than the 1959-63 average. Holdings of all frozen poultry advanced 132 million pounds to 473 million, 3 percent less than stocks on November 1, 1964 but 3 percent more than average for the date.

Frozen fruit holdings on November 1 were 566 million pounds compared with 608 million a year earlier and average holdings of 537 million pounds. Except for gains in stocks of frozen apples, grapes, peaches, and miscellaneous frozen fruits, November 1 holdings of the major fruit packs were lower than on October 1. The drop during October was 6 million pounds, about half that in October 1964 and average. Storage gains in frozen vegetables during October raised the November 1 inventory to 1.4 billion pounds. This time last year, 1.3 billion pounds were in storage and average stocks are 1.2 billion. Holdings of orange concentrate decreased 9 million gallons to 30 million on November 1. These stocks were about two-thirds larger than at this time last year and 11 percent larger than average.

Butter holdings were reduced 37 million pounds during October to 124 million on November 1. Government stocks were 88 million pounds, leaving 36 million for commercial use. American cheese stocks were down to 309 million pounds after the October decline of 32 million pounds. During October 1964, a 16-million pound drop left 302 million pounds in storage on November 1. The average decline is 21 million pounds and average November 1 stocks are 358 million pounds.

Warehouse stocks of beef moved up 11 million pounds during October to 204 million, 59 million less than at this time last year and 25 million more than average. Pork holdings were up 1 million pounds to 127 million on November 1. Canned ham stocks totaled 40 million pounds on November 1, down 2 million from a month earlier.

A special survey was made on November 1 to determine the proportion of the total canned ham stocks that were foreign or imported holdings. The following regional distribution resulted. In the New England Region, foreign hams comprised 83 percent of the total stocks; Middle Atlantic, 86 percent; East North Central, 25 percent; West North Central, 1 percent, South Atlantic, 49 percent; East South Central, none; West South Central, 45 percent; Mountain, 13 percent; and Pacific, 52 percent. The weighted percent for the United States was 35 percent.

Storage Occupancy in Public Warehouses

Occupancy of cooler space in public refrigerated warehouses increased 3 percentage points during October while freezer space decreased 1 point. On November 1, cooler occupancy was 57 percent of capacity, 3 points above a month earlier but 1 point under a year earlier. Average for November 1 is 61 percent. Freezer occupancy was 69 percent, compared with 70 percent a month earlier, and 71 percent on November 1, 1964.

Dairy Products

Holdings of fluid cream totaled 7 million pounds on November 1, down 700,000 pounds from both a month and a year earlier. Average holdings for this date are 10 million pounds. Stocks were lowered during October in all regions except the New England, East North Central, East South Central, and Mountain. Creamery butter holdings fell 37 million pounds during October to 124 million on November 1. This drop was 1 million more than last year and 10 million pounds larger than the average October decline. Stocks declined in all areas of the country except the Mountain States. The sharpest declines were in the East and West North Central Regions where total butter holdings were reduced 28 million pounds during October.

American cheese holdings in the East North Central States were reduced by 16 million pounds during October and in the West North Central States an additional 7 million pounds were withdrawn from storage. These declines, when coupled with lesser reductions in other areas, brought November 1 stocks down 32 million to 309 million pounds. At this time last year, stocks totaled 302 million pounds after a 16-million pound reduction. The average October decline is 21 million pound and average November 1 stocks are 358 million pounds.

Poultry and Poultry Products

In all regions of the country, there was a buildup in frozen turkey stocks during October of 123 million pounds and on November 1 supplies totaled 365 million pounds. During October 1964, a 109-million-pound gain brought November 1 supplies to 342 million pounds. Average holdings for this time of year are 317 million million pounds. Holdings of all poultry totaled 473 million pounds, 15 million less than on November 1, 1964 but 15 million more than average.

Shell egg holdings were down to 234 thousand cases after the October decline of 87 thousand cases. Stocks were two-thirds more than at this time last year, but 7 percent less than average for the date. Frozen egg stocks were down to 82 million pounds compared with 84 million a year earlier and average November 1 stocks of 99 million pounds. During October, stocks declined 13 million, the same as in 1964. The average decline for the month is 17 million pounds.

Meat and Meat Products

November 1 stocks of beef were 204 million pounds, up 11 million from a month earlier but down 59 million pounds from November 1 last year. Average holdings for the date are 179 million pounds. The October gain was 5 million pounds larger than in 1964 and 6 million greater than average. Frozen beef holdings increased in all regions during October and on November 1 totaled 190 million pounds, 7 percent larger than the previous month. Cured beef supplies, however, were down 12 percent from October 1 because of lower holdings in the Middle Atlantic, East and West North Central, East South Central, Mountain, and Pacific Regions.

Holdings of pork were up slightly from October 1. A gain of about 1 million pounds brought November 1 stocks to 127 million pounds compared with 222 million a year earlier and average holdings of 167 million pounds. The October net change in pork holdings was considerably less than in 1964 when stocks increased 38 million pounds and the average October gain of 7 million. Frozen pork stocks at 102 million pounds were down 85 million pounds and cured pork holdings of 25 million were 10 million less than in 1964.

Fruits, Vegetables, and Juices

November 1 stocks of fresh applies were 57 million bushels of which 12 million were in controlled atmosphere rooms. Total supplies were up 1 million bushels from a year earlier and 6 million bushels more than average. Frozen fruit holdings declined from a month earlier following reductions in stocks of all frozen fruits except apples, grapes, and peaches and miscellaneous frozen fruits. Total stocks of frozen fruit were 566 million pounds compared with 571 million pounds on October 1, and 608 million pounds on November 1 a year earlier. October net gains of frozen vegetables of 97 million pounds raised supplies to 1,409 million pounds on November 1, 7 percent higher than a month ago and 8 percent higher than a year ago. Supplies were higher for all frozen vegetables except asparagus, snapbeans, and greenpeas. Orange concentrate supplies were down to 30 million gallons on November 1, after an October decline of 9 million gallons.

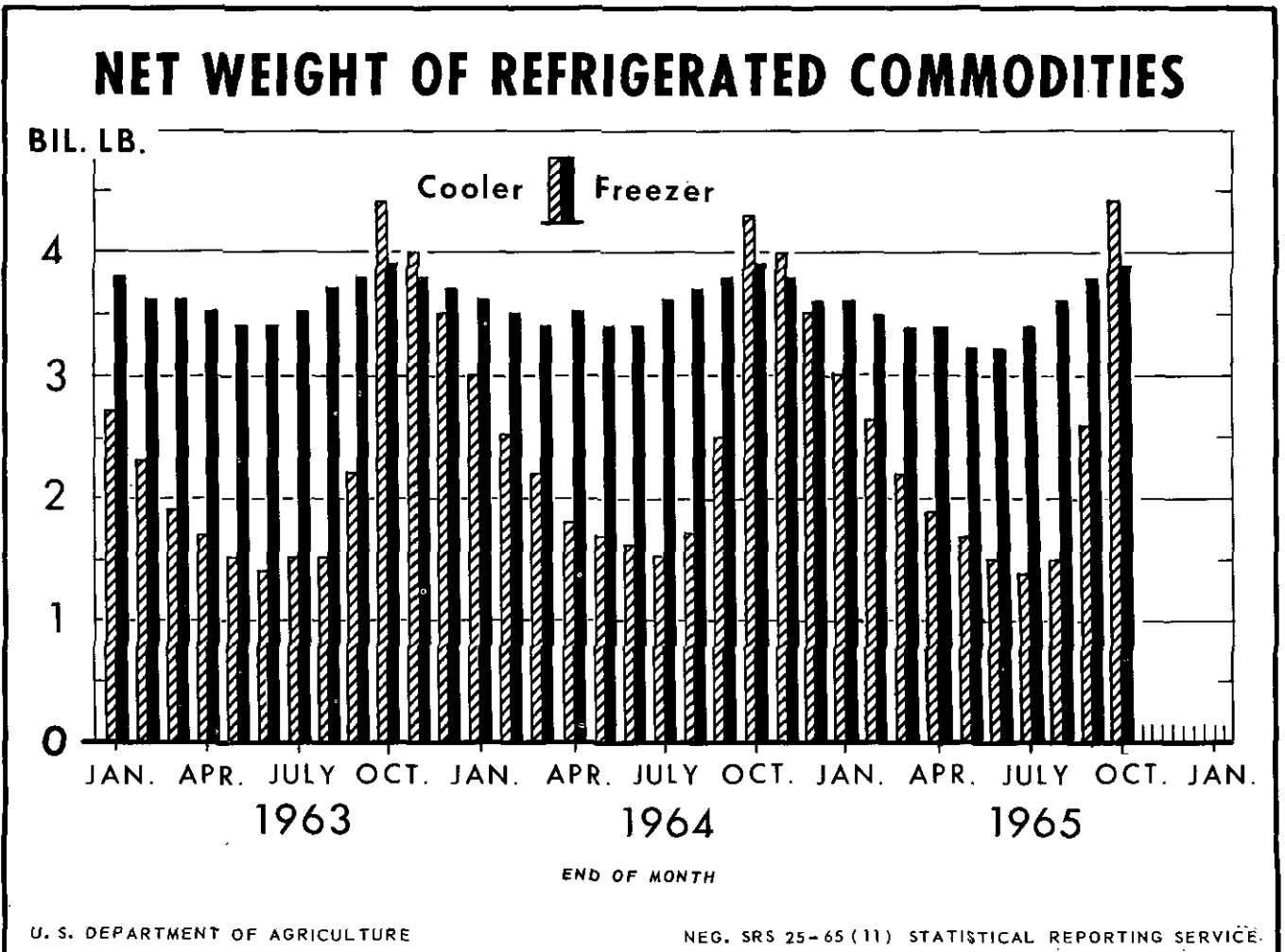
