Commodity Summary

January 1 supplies of butter were down to 50 million pounds after a 33-million pound decrease during December. Stocks were 24 percent less than a year earlier and 71 percent under the 1959-63 average. Government-owned butter totaled 21 million pounds on January 1, down 32 million from the previous month. American cheese supplies were lowered by 29 million pounds during December. On January 1, stocks totaled 268 million pounds compared with 284 million last year and average holdings of 333 million pounds.

Shell egg holdings were 81 thousand cases, and frozen eggs 51 million pounds on January 1. Shell egg holdings were 31 percent larger than at this time last year but 16 percent below average. Frozen egg stocks were 12 percent below a year earlier and 21 percent below average.

Supplies of frozen turkeys were down sharply. The 81-million pound December decline brought January 1 holdings to 198 million pounds. Although these stocks were 4 percent smaller than on January 1, 1965, they were about average for the date. Total frozen poultry holdings of 314 million pounds were down 12 percent from a year earlier and 10 percent from average.

Frozen orange juice holdings were 22 million gallons, 4 million more than at this time last year, and 1 million gallons less than average. The December reduction of 3 million gallons contrasts with the December 1964 gain of 4 million and the average gain of 1 million gallons. Frozen fruit holdings were down 30 million pounds to 522 million. This reduction was 4 million short of the December 1964 reduction and 1 million short of average. Frozen vegetable supplies were 1,391 million pounds compared with 1,216 million a year earlier. Average January 1 holdings are 1,124 million pounds.

Meat in storage totaled 488 million pounds on January 1, up 35 million from a month earlier. Stocks of beef and pork moved up during December but other meats declined. January 1 supplies of beef were about 260 million pounds, up 25 million from December 1; pork gained 11 million during the month to total 153 million pounds; but other meats declined 1 million pounds to 76 million.

Space Occupancy in Public Warehouses

Occupancy of freezer space declined 4 points during December to 63 percent. On January 1 a year ago, occupancy was 68 percent and average for the date is 73 percent. Utilization of freezer space declined in all regions of the country except New England which showed a 2-point increase during the month.

Cooler space occupancy was 53 percent compared with 55 percent a month ago and 56 percent a year ago. Average is 57 percent. The West South Central and Pacific Regions each showed a 1-point increase during the month and all other regions decreased.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

January 1 stocks in cooler rooms totaled 3.4 billion pounds following a decrease of 636 million pounds during December. Stocks were lower than on December 1 for all commodities except nuts and dried and evaporated fruits. Freezer room stocks decreased 198 million pounds to 3.6 billion. Stocks of beef and pork, were higher than the previous month. Stocks of all other commodities were lower; butter, cream, eggs, and poultry showed the most significant declines.

Dairy Products

January 1 stocks of creamery butter totaled 50 million pounds, down 33 million from a month earlier and 16 million from a year earlier. Average holdings are 172 million pounds. The December decline was 4 million greater than last year and 15 million more than average.

American cheese totaled 268 million pounds on January 1 compared with 284 million this time last year and the average of 333 million pounds. The total net withdrawal of 29 million pounds during December was about three times the reduction of a year earlier and the average. Holdings of cream totaled 6 million pounds, down 1 million from a month earlier. January 1 stocks at 6 million pounds were just under those of last year and average.

Meat Products

Storage supplies of meat increased during December by more than the average amount. The 35-million-pound net gain compared with the 30-million average December rise and the 36-million gain of December 1964. January 1 stocks totaled 488 million pounds, 30 percent less than on January 1, 1965 and 7 percent less than average.

A 25-million pound December gain brought beef supplies on January 1 to 260 million pounds compared with 315 million a year earlier. Average holdings for this time of year are 207 million pounds. Pork on hand January 1 totaled 153 million pounds, 11 million more than on December 1, but 130 million less than on January 1, 1965. The average gain for this time of year is 22 million pounds and average holdings are 228 million pounds. Frozen pork stocks, at 125 million pounds, increased 15 million pounds during the month but cured pork holdings of 28 million were 3 million less than a month earlier.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks decreased 76 million pounds during December and totaled 314 million pounds on January 1. The January 1 inventory was 12 percent less than a year earlier and 10 percent less than average. Holdings of frozen turkeys of 198 million pounds were 29 percent less than the previous month, 4 percent less than on January 1 last year, and about the same as average. Stocks declined 81 million pounds during December compared to a decline of 66 million pounds during December a year ago and the average decline of 54 million pounds. Supplies of frozen eggs were 51 million pounds -- 12 percent less than a year earlier and 21 percent less than average. Stocks of shell eggs were 81 thousand cases, 31 percent larger than this time last year but 16 percent below average.

Fruits, Vegetables and Juices

January 1 stocks of frozen fruits were 522 million pounds, down 30 million pounds from a month earlier. Holdings of all frozen fruit except apples were reduced during December. Supplies of frozen fruit were 5 percent less than on January 1, 1965 but 7 percent above average. Strawberry stocks of 123 million pounds were 31 million pounds under average for the date and 35 million less than on January 1 last year. Frozen vegetable supplies on January 1 totaled 1,391 million pounds, compared with 1,216 million a year earlier and 1,124 million the average. Supplies were reduced for all frozen vegetables except brussels sprouts, french fries, mixed vegetables, mixed peas and carrots and "other" frozen vegetables. Holdings of french fries increased 39 million pounds during December. Orange concentrate supplies were down to 22 million gallons on January 1, after a December decline of 3 million gallons.
