

COLD STORAGE *Report*

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[Data for this report are collected from public, private, and semiprivate warehouses, apple houses, and meat-packing plants where food products are generally stored for 30 days or more. Commodities in space owned or leased and operated by the armed services are not reported. All June 30, data are preliminary.]

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COLD STORAGE REPORT, JULY 1, 1966

Commodity Summary

Warehouse holdings of frozen fruit, juices, cream, butter, cheese, eggs, beef, and milk increased during June but stocks of fresh fruits, vegetables, poultry, pork, and nuts were reduced, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

July 1 stocks of frozen fruit were up to 430 million pounds after a 94-million pound gain. Total stocks were 13 percent larger than on July 1, 1965 and 31 percent higher than the July 1, 1960-64 average. A record June gain of 109 million pounds in strawberry stocks raised July 1 holdings to 210 million pounds compared with 158 million stored a year earlier and average stocks of 163 million pounds.

Frozen orange concentrate holdings were up 2 million gallons to 54 million gallons. Stocks were 4 million less than at this time last year but 5 million more than average.

July 1 stocks of cream were up 3 million pounds to 20 million and a 33-million gain in butter stocks brought July 1 stocks to 86 million pounds. Holdings on July 1, 1965 were 208 million pounds and 289 million is average for the date. American cheese stocks were 305 million pounds compared with 333 million at this time last year and 374 million is average.

Shell egg stocks were 104 thousand cases on July 1, up 28 thousand from June 1. Frozen egg stocks gained 12 million pounds during June to 54 million on July 1. Both shell egg and frozen egg stocks were below July 1, 1965 levels and average.

Frozen poultry in refrigerated warehouses totaled 148 million pounds after a 2-million pound June reduction. The 66 million pounds of turkeys in storage on July 1 compared with 70 million a year earlier and the 94 million pound average. Frozen vegetable holdings were reduced 54 million pounds during June, leaving 1,047 million in storage on July 1. Year earlier stocks were 819 million pounds and the average is 825 million pounds. Gains in stocks of asparagus, broccoli, peas, and spinach were exceeded by reductions in other vegetable packs, principally french fries.

Meat stocks on July 1 totaled 514 million pounds, following a June decline of 58 million pounds. A year earlier the decline was 117 million pounds which left 493 million pounds in storage on July 1, 1965. The average decline is 44 million pounds and average stocks 610 million pounds. Frozen pork bellies totaled 47 million pounds after an 18-million pound June reduction. Stocks declined in all sections of the country. The reduction in the East North Central area was 6 million pounds and in the West North Central, 10 million. Stocks in the East North Central dropped 17 percent and in the West North Central 43 percent.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

July 1 product weight in cooler rooms totaled 1.5 billion pounds, down 6 percent from June 1. Reduction in stocks of fresh fruits, fresh vegetables, nuts, pork and canned meats more than matched gains in other cooler-held stocks. The July 1 weight in cooler rooms was below a year earlier but above average for the date. Freezer-held stocks were up 2 percent to 3.3 billion pounds, the result of June gains in stocks of fruits, cream, butter, eggs, juices, and beef. July 1 total holdings were larger than a year earlier and average.

Space Occupancy in Public Warehouses

Utilization of both cooler and freezer rooms increased during June. July 1 cooler occupancy at 51 percent was one point more than a month earlier but 4 points less than average. Occupancy of freezer space was 59 percent, 2 points above June 1 but 9 points below average.

Fruits, Juices and Vegetables

Frozen fruit holdings increased 94 million pounds during June and on July 1 totaled 430 million. The principal increase was in stocks of strawberries which were 109 million larger than on June 1. Strawberry stocks were 210 million pounds compared with 158 million a year earlier and the average of 163 million. Holdings of frozen apples totaled 58 million pounds, 8 million less than on June 1.

Orange concentrate stocks of 54 million gallons were 2 million larger than a month earlier. Holdings were 8 percent less than on this date in 1965 but 10 percent more than average.

July 1 holdings of frozen vegetables totaled 1,047 million pounds, 54 million less than a month earlier. Stocks decreased during June for all vegetables except asparagus, broccoli, green peas, and spinach. Holdings of french fries totaled 356 million, 20 percent less than on June 1. Holdings a year earlier were 178 million and the average is 194 million pounds.

Dairy Products

Butter holdings increased 33 million pounds during June and on July 1 totaled 86 million. Year earlier stocks were 208 million and the average is 289 million. Government holdings accounted for 2 million pounds of the July 1 total.

American cheese stocks of 305 million pounds were 10 percent more than a month earlier but 9 percent less than a year earlier. Average for the date is 374 million. The New England area had lower holdings than on June 1 but all other regions increased. The most significant increase was in the East South Central.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks on July 1 were 148 million pounds, 2 million less than on June 1. Year-earlier stocks were 159 million pounds and the average is 191 million. Turkey holdings decreased 3 million pounds to 66 million on July 1. Stocks were lower than a month earlier in all regions except the South Atlantic, Mountain and Pacific. Holdings on this date in 1965 were 70 million and average is 94 million pounds.

Stocks of frozen eggs totaled 54 million pounds, 28 percent larger than a month earlier but 36 percent smaller than a year earlier. The average is 118 million pounds. Holdings of shell eggs were 104 thousand cases, up from the 76 thousand cases on June 1 but considerably less than the 525 thousand cases on hand a year earlier and the average of 469 thousand.

Meat Products

Mid-year stocks of beef-in storage totaled 207 million pounds, up 2 million from June 1. Increases in frozen beef in the Middle Atlantic, East South Central and Pacific States made up the major share of the total beef gain which raised stocks 20 percent above July 1, 1965 and 15 percent above average.

Total pork holdings on July 1, amounted to 213 million pounds, 11 million pounds less than a year earlier and 111 million less than average. The June pork reduction of 55 million pounds was 13 million less than in 1965 but 16 million more than average. Holdings of all frozen and cured pork items were reduced during June but the greatest reductions were in frozen hams and pork bellies.
