

COLD STORAGE *Report*

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[Data for this report are collected from public, private, and semiprivate warehouses, apple houses, and meat-packing plants where food products are generally stored for 30 days or more. Commodities in space owned or leased and operated by the armed services are not reported. All November 30, 1966 data are preliminary.]

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COLD STORAGE REPORT, DECEMBER 1, 1966

Commodity Summary

December 1 stocks of creamery butter were 40 million pounds, the lowest for the date since 1932, according to the Crop Reporting Board. These stocks were about half the holdings on December 1, 1965 and about one-fifth of average. Shell egg holdings fell to a new December 1 low with 23 thousand cases in storage and the 39 million pounds of frozen eggs were the lowest for any December 1 since 1926.

Refrigerated warehouse holdings of frozen turkeys were down to 318 million pounds on December 1, just under the record high for the month reached in 1961. Holdings of all poultry totaled 474 million pounds, 21 percent more than at this time last year and 14 percent more than the December 1, 1960-64 average.

American cheese stocks declined 11 million pounds during November to 321 million on December 1. Year earlier holdings were 297 million pounds and average stocks are 345 million pounds. Holdings of fresh apples were down to 45 million bushels after a November disappearance of 10 million bushels. Pears in storage totaled 3 million boxes following a 1-million box decline.

Frozen fruit stored on December 1 totaled 587 million pounds, up 6 percent from December 1, 1965 and 9 percent from average. Stocks of all fruit packs were lowered during November except frozen apples. The net reduction of 25 million pounds was 5 million more than a year earlier and 6 million more than average.

December 1 stocks of frozen vegetables were 1,629 million pounds, the largest on record for the date. The November decline of 12 million pounds contrasts with the 18 million pounds that moved into storage during November 1965 and the average decline of 15 million pounds.

Orange concentrate holdings declined seasonally during November by 6 million gallons leaving 19 million on hand December 1. These stocks were about 23 percent below a year earlier and 5 percent below average.

Meat in storage amounted to 567 million pounds, 58 million more than on November 1. This gain was 16 million more than a year earlier but 9 million less than average. All meat items except frozen hams increased during November.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

Utilization of both cooler and freezer rooms decreased by one point during November. December 1 cooler occupancy was 56 percent and freezer was 72 percent. Lower utilization of cooler rooms in the New England, East North Central, South Atlantic, and Pacific regions more than offset increases in other regions. Freezer utilization decreased in all areas except the New England, West North Central and Mountain. Average occupancy of cooler space is 60 percent and freezer space is 75 percent.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Cooler-held stocks declined 511 million pounds during November and on December 1 totaled 3.9 billion pounds. The largest decrease was in stocks of fresh apples which dropped by 489 million pounds. Holdings of pears, other fresh fruits, dairy products, shell eggs, and miscellaneous products also declined during the month and more than offset increases in meats, nuts, fresh vegetables, and dried and evaporated fruits.

Stocks in freezer rooms declined 131 million pounds to a total of 4.1 billion on December 1. Holdings of beef, pork, veal, and miscellaneous commodities increased while stocks of all other products decreased.

Poultry and Poultry Products

November reductions in total frozen poultry holdings throughout the country except in the West North Central brought December 1 holdings to 474 million pounds. Reductions ranged from 25 percent, in the East North Central States, mostly turkeys, to 8 percent in the South Atlantic, where gains in stocks of broilers, roasters, and fowl partially offset declines in other poultry items. Total warehouse holdings of broilers were up 15 percent from November 1 to 34 million pounds and a 2-million pound gain raised roaster stocks to 13 million pounds. Fowl in storage on December 1 amounted to 49 million pounds after a November gain of 9 million. The 318 million pounds of turkeys on December 1 compared with 280 million a year earlier and 271 million the December 1, 1960-64 average.

Shell egg stocks totaled 23 thousand cases, 25 thousand less than a month earlier and 103 thousand less than a year earlier. Average stocks are 111 thousand cases. Frozen eggs stored on December 1 were 39 million pounds. At this time last year 64 million pounds were in storage and the average is 74 million pounds.

Dairy Products

Stocks of butter declined 18 million pounds during November and on December 1 totaled 40 million pounds. Holdings were less than one-half as much as a year earlier and one-fifth as large as average. Government-owned stocks accounted for 0.7 million pounds of the total. December 1 holdings of American cheese totaled 321 million pounds compared with 333 million a month earlier and 297 million a year earlier. Average holdings for the date are 345 million pounds. Stocks declined in all areas except the West North Central.

Fruits, Vegetables, and Juices

Warehouse holdings of frozen fruits were 587 million pounds on December 1, down 4 percent from November 1. Stocks were reduced in most areas of the country except in the Middle Atlantic where holdings were unchanged and in the South Atlantic States where stocks increased 5 percent. At this time last year, national holdings were 556 million pounds and the average is 536 million pounds. Only frozen apple stocks increased during November as withdrawals during the month lowered holdings of other fruit packs.

A 1-percent November decline in frozen vegetable holdings brought December 1 stocks to 1,629 million pounds. This was 13 percent more than on December 1, 1965 and 30 percent more than average. Stocks of asparagus, lima beans, snap beans, corn, peas, and spinach were lowered seasonally and more than out weighed gains in other frozen vegetable packs. Holdings of green peas were down to 257 million pounds after a 37-million pound November decrease; french fries moved up to 342 million pounds following a 44-million pound gain.

Frozen orange juice totaled 19 million gallons on December 1, down 6 million from November 1. These stocks were down 23 percent from both a month earlier and year earlier holdings but they were only 5 percent below average.

Meat and Meat Products

During November stocks of all classes of meats increased except frozen hams and lamb and mutton. The net gain of 58 million pounds brought December 1 warehouse stocks to 567 million pounds. This was 25 percent more than on December 1, 1965 and 7 percent more than average. Beef holdings were up to 278 million pounds after a 25-million pound November increase. Pork, at 204 million pounds, was 33 million pounds greater than on November 1, 1966. Other meats totaled 85 million pounds following a 344-thousand pound gain.
