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COLD STORAGE REPORT, JANUARY 1, 1967

Commodity Summary

January 1, 1967 stocks of frozen turkeys were 273 million pounds, the largest on record for the date, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Total poultry holdings of 439 million pounds compared with 315 million a year earlier and 358 million, the 1961-65 average.

Warehouse stocks of butter were 33 million pounds after a 6-million pound decline in December. American cheese holdings declined 11 million to 314 million pounds. Stocks for both products were below average for the date but cheese was larger than a year earlier.

Shell egg holdings rose to 30 thousand cases, a gain of 7 thousand from a month earlier. Frozen egg stocks declined 3 million pounds to 36 million. Stocks of shell and frozen eggs were lower than at this time last year and also below average for January 1.

The December frozen fruit decline was 35 million pounds--8 million more than in 1965 and 4 million more than average. Holdings of 549 million pounds were 4 percent above year earlier stocks and 8 percent above average. Frozen vegetable stocks on January 1 totaled 1,595 million pounds compared with 1,407 million on January 1, 1966. Average holdings are 1,198 million pounds.

Frozen orange concentrate in refrigerated warehouses declined less than 1 million gallons during December and on January 1 totaled 18 million gallons. A 3-million-gallon reduction in December 1965 left 22 million gallons the same as average for January 1.

Meat in storage totaled 624 million pounds, up 60 million from December 1. Beef holdings increased 30 million pounds to 303 million and a 34-million-pound gain in pork stocks brought the total to 239 million pounds. Other meat stocks declined 4 million pounds to 82 million.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

Occupancy of public cooler rooms decreased by 1 point and freezer rooms by 3 points during December. Higher cooler occupancy in the South Atlantic, East South Central, and West South Central was more than offset by lower occupancy in other regions. January 1 cooler occupancy was 55 percent compared with 53 percent a year earlier and the average of 58 percent. Occupancy of freezer rooms was lower in all regions except in the New England, Mountain and Mid-Atlantic. January 1 occupancy was 69 percent--up 5 points from a year earlier but down 3 points from average.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Cooler-held stocks decreased 541 million pounds during December and on January 1 totaled 3.5 billion. Holdings of all commodities were lower than the previous month except dried and evaporated fruits, nuts, and shell eggs.

Stocks in freezer rooms totaled 4.1 billion pounds on January 1--down 58 million from December 1. Increases in meats and miscellaneous items were more than offset by lower stocks of all other commodities.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Stocks of frozen poultry totaled 439 million pounds on January 1, 29 million less than a month earlier but 124 million more than a year earlier. Average stocks for the date are 358 million. A decline in stocks of turkeys and ducks during December more than offset increases for broilers, hens, roasters, and unclassified poultry. The inventory of frozen turkeys, of 273 million pounds, was down 39 million pounds from the previous month but ~~was~~ 73 million more than January 1 a year ago. Average stocks are 210 million.

Shell egg stocks totaled 30 thousand cases, a 7 thousand case increase during December. Stocks decreased 41 thousand cases during December a year earlier and the average change is a decrease of 39 thousand cases. January 1 stocks were higher than the previous month in all regions except the East South Central, Mountain, and Pacific where they were unchanged and the Middle Atlantic where they were lower.

Frozen eggs in storage on January 1 totaled 36 million pounds compared with 39 million a month earlier and 51 million a year earlier.

Dairy Products

January 1 stocks of butter were 33 million pounds, 15 percent less than a month earlier and 36 percent less than a year earlier. Average January 1 holdings are 179 million pounds. Government holdings accounted for 2 million pounds of current stocks. Holdings of American cheese declined 11 million pounds during December and totaled 314 million on January 1. Year earlier stocks were 271 million pounds and average is 336 million.

Fruits, Juices and Vegetables

Warehouse stocks of frozen fruits totaled 549 million pounds on January 1, down 6 percent from December 1. Average stocks for the date are 506 million pounds. Inventories of all commodities declined during the month except apples which increased 15 million pounds.

Orange concentrate holdings declined 1 million gallons during December compared with a 3 million gallon decrease a year earlier and the average increase of 2 million gallons. January 1 stocks totaled 18 million gallons, 17 percent less than a year earlier and average.

January 1 stocks of frozen vegetables totaled 1,595 million pounds-~~55-million~~ less than on December 1. Holdings declined during the month for all commodities except brussels sprouts, carrots, cauliflower, mixed vegetables, peas and carrots and french fried potatoes. Stocks of french fries of 399 million pounds were 85 million more than year earlier stocks and 203 million above average.

Meat and Meat Products

January 1 holdings of beef were 303 million pounds, up 30 million from a month earlier. The gain was in frozen beef which increased 32 million to 287 million but partially offsetting was a 2-million-pound loss in cooler beef holdings. Frozen pork holdings totaled 209 million pounds, up 38 million from December 1. Gains were reported for all frozen pork items except ham. It declined 10 million pounds to 17 million. Frozen pork bellies moved up to 48 million pounds following a 28-million pound gain in December.
