COLD STORAGE REPORT, FEBRUARY 1, 1967

Commodity Summary

Warehouse holdings of orange concentrate, butter, shell eggs, frozen eggs and total meats increased during January while stocks of fresh and frozen fruits, frozen vegetables, and total poultry decreased. Stocks of frozen french fries were 451 million pounds, a new record for the date.

Beef in storage on February 1, totaled 323 million pounds, 16 million more than on January 1 and 71 million more than a year earlier. Pork holdings increased 21 million pounds during January and on February 1 were 255 million--99 million more than year earlier stocks but 5 million less than average.

An increase of 9 million gallons raised February 1 stocks of orange concentrate to 27 million. The January increase was 5 million gallons more than the increase a year earlier but the same as average. Stocks of orange concentrate at this time in 1966 were 25 million gallons and average is 31 million.

Holdings of frozen vegetables declined 99 million pounds during January and on February 1 totaled 1,514 million. Frozen french fries increased during the month but inventories of all other vegetables decreased.

Frozen fruit holdings decreased by 39 million pounds during January compared with the 47-million pound decrease a year earlier and the average decline of 41 million. An increase in stocks of frozen apples was more than offset by lower stocks of other fruits. The February 1 inventory, at 512 million pounds, was 10 percent above average.

Holdings of shell eggs increased by 36 thousand cases during January to 63 thousand on February 1. Stocks decreased 9 thousand cases during this period a year earlier and the average change is an increase of 1,000 cases.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

February 1 occupancy of freezer rooms, at 71 percent, was unchanged from January 1, but was 10 percentage points higher than a year earlier and 1 point higher than average. Higher occupancy in the New England, East North Central, West South Central and Mountain Regions was offset by decreases in most other areas. The West North Central region was unchanged from a month earlier.

Utilization of cooler rooms on February 1, at 57 percent, was 1 point higher than on January 1. Year earlier occupancy was 50 percent and the average is 55. Lower occupancy in the Middle Atlantic, West South Central and Mountain regions on February 1 was more than offset by increases in all other regions.

Cooler and Freezer Changes

Cooler-held stocks decreased by 407 million pounds during January and on February 1 totaled 2.9 billion. Smaller holdings of fresh apples and pears, dried and evaporated fruits, dairy products, and miscellaneous commodities more than offset increases in other items.

Stocks in freezer rooms totaled 4.1 billion on February 1, down 12 million from January 1. Stocks of cream, frozen poultry, and frozen fruits and vegetables were less than a month earlier--more than offsetting larger inventories of other commodities.

Dairy Products

February 1 stocks of creamery butter totaled 36 million pounds, 4 million more than a month earlier and 2 million more than at this time last year. Average holdings for February 1 are 175 million pounds. During January, Government-owned stocks of butter advanced to 10 million pounds, a gain of 8 million for the month. Year earlier stocks were 9 million pounds. American cheese holdings were 318 million pounds, a 4-million pound decline in January. Supplies were 55 million larger than on February 1, 1966 but 2 million pounds below average. Stocks of fluid cream were reduced 2 million pounds to 7 million on February 1 while holdings of plastic cream were unchanged at 2 million pounds.

Fruits, Juices and Vegetables

February 1 holdings of frozen fruits totaled 512 million pounds-39 million pounds less than a month earlier. Stocks of all frozen fruits declined during the month except apples which increased 11 million pounds. The February 1 inventory was 30 million pounds more than a year earlier and 48 million more than average.

Orange concentrate stocks increased 9 million gallons during January and totaled 27 million on February 1. Year earlier holdings totaled 25 million gallons and average is 31 million.

Total frozen vegetables in storage on February 1 were 1,514 million pounds, 99 million less than a month earlier but 177 million more than a year earlier. Average stocks for the date are 1,116 million pounds. Stocks of french fries increased 41 million pounds during the month to a new February 1 high of 451 million. Holdings of all other frozen vegetables decreased during January.

Meat Products

A 45-million-pound January gain raised meat stocks to 666 million pounds on February 1. These holdings were 38 percent larger than a year earlier and 16 percent above average. The January gains were in beef, rising 16 million pounds and in pork, advancing 21 million to 255 million pounds. Other meats (veal, lamb and mutton, and canned meats) increased 8 million to 89 million pounds. Both beef and pork were larger than a year earlier. Holdings of other meats were below average for February 1, but above a year earlier.

Poultry and Poultry Products

February 1 holdings of frozen poultry were 430 million pounds, down 6 million from January 1. Stocks were 51 percent more than on February 1, 1966 and 24 percent more than average. Holdings of frozen turkeys amounted to 270 million pounds--33 million were other than whole birds. This time last year, turkey holdings, whole and parts, were 182 million and the average is 207 million pounds.

Holdings of shell eggs on February 1 were up sharply from a month earlier. A 36-million case gain brought February 1 stocks to 63 thousand with more than half being in Illinois. Shell eggs stored last year amounted to 76 thousand, and the average is 73 thousand cases. Frozen egg stocks were 37 million pounds, about the same as last year but 13 million pounds short of the average.

NOTE: Apples are now shown in pounds (million) instead of bushels (thousand) because of varying container weights. Beginning with this report; turkey stocks are reported separately for whole birds and other than whole birds. Comparable data for 1966 and average are not available on turkeys.
