COLD STORAGE REPORT, APRIL 1, 1967

Commodity Summary

April 1 stocks of frozen orange concentrate, butter, cheese, cream, nuts, frozen eggs, pork, and "other meats" increased during March according to the Crop Reporting Board. Inventories were lower than a month earlier for most fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables, shell eggs, poultry, and beef.

Orange concentrate holdings on April 1 totaled 48 million gallons compared with 40 million on March 1 and the average of 38 million.

Stocks of butter increased 20 million pounds during March and totaled 75 million on April 1. Year-earlier stocks were 26 million and the average is 207 million. American cheese holdings increased 11 million during March to 319 million pounds on April 1. There was a 9 million decrease during the comparable period in 1966, and the average change for March is a decline of 6 million. American cheese stocks were higher than a month earlier in all regions except the South Atlantic and West South Central.

Shell egg holdings declined 29 percent during March but frozen egg stocks increased 10 percent. The 39 thousand cases of shell eggs on hand on April 1 compared with 55 thousand a month earlier and average stocks of 48 thousand cases. Usually stocks increase during this month. April 1 frozen egg holdings of 45 million pounds were 21 million more than year-earlier stocks but 3 million less than average.

Total frozen fruit holdings of 414 million on April 1 were 3 percent more than at this time last year and 14 percent above average. Inventories were lower than a month earlier for all items.

April 1 stocks of frozen vegetables totaled 1,374 million pounds. Holdings of broccoli, french fried potatoes, spinach, and miscellaneous items increased but inventories of all other commodities decreased during March. The March decline of 65 million pounds is 22 million pounds more than the March 1966 decrease and 20 million pounds more than average.

Inventories of pork items were higher than on March 1 except frozen hams which decreased by 3 million pounds and dry salt bellies which decreased slightly. Pork in storage on April 1 totaled 337 million pounds. Beef inventories decreased by 9 million pounds during March and on April 1 totaled 304 million, one-third more than a year earlier.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

April 1 occupancy of cooler rooms, at 56 percent, was the same as a month earlier but 2 points higher than average. Higher occupancy in the Pacific, Mountain and most Central regions was offset by lower utilization in the Mid-Atlantic and East North Central. The New England and South-Atlantic regions were unchanged from March 1.

Utilization of freezer rooms was 69 percent on April 1--unchanged from March 1 but 3 points above average. Occupancy was higher than a month earlier in the Mid-Atlantic and South Atlantic regions--offsetting lower occupancy in most other areas.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

April 1 stocks in cooler rooms totaled 2.2 billion pounds following a 347 million pound March decline. Holdings of fruits, vegetables, evaporated and condensed milk, egg, and beef were lower during March but the declines were partly offset by gains in stocks of dried and evaporated fruits, nuts, cheese, pork and canned meats.

Freezer room stocks declined 46 million pounds to 4.1 billion on April 1. Stocks of freezer items were higher than on March 1 except poultry, fruits, vegetables, and beef. The largest gain was 83 million pounds of frozen juices and the sharpest drop was 64 million pounds of frozen vegetables.

Meat Products

Holdings of meat increased 41 million pounds during March to 738 million on April 1. Pork, lamb and mutton, and canned meats advanced during the month but partially offsetting were declines in beef, and veal. Frozen pork totaled 304 million pounds, up 46 million from March 1, 1967 and 118 million from April 1, 1966. Frozen pork bellies had the sharpest gain, 23 million, and totaled 91 million on April 1, 1967. Cured pork stocks moved up 1 million pounds from March 1, to 33 million. Canned meat holdings on April 1 were 69 million pounds compared with 66 million a month earlier. Frozen beef declined 9 million during March to 289 million pounds on April 1. Year earlier stocks were 213 million pounds and the average is 191 million pounds.

Fruits, Vegetables, and Juices

Frozen fruit stored on April 1 amounted to 414 million pounds, down 57 million from March 1, and 14 million from April 1, 1966. Average holdings for the date are 365 million pounds. Stocks for all fruit packs were reduced during the month, the principal reduction was 14 million pounds of frozen strawberries. April 1 holdings were 109 million pounds, 22 million more than on April 1, 1966 and 14 million more than average.

Frozen vegetable holdings were down to 1,374 million pounds following a 65 million pound March decline. Reductions in stocks of corn and peas, each decreased by about 31 million pounds, and declines for other vegetable packs were partly offset by a 25-million pound gain in stocks of french fries, a 17 million pound gain in spinach, and a 6 million pound gain in broccoli. Holdings of french fries totaled a record 504 million pounds on April 1--the first frozen vegetable to reach one-half billion pounds.

Orange juice stocks were up to 48 million gallons, a gain of 8 million from March 1. Holdings were 12 million larger than on April 1, 1966 and 10 million larger than average.

Dairy Products

Supplies of creamery butter in refrigerated storage totaled 75 million pounds on April 1 compared with 26 million a year earlier and average stocks of 207 million pounds. The March gain was 20 million pounds, about average for the month, but contrasted to the 1-million pound decline during March 1966. Government owned butter on April 1 totaled 46 million pounds, up from 29 million a month earlier.

American cheese holdings were 319 million pounds, up 84 million from April 1, 1966 and 20 million from average. The March net gain of 11 million pounds compared with a 9-million pound decline a year earlier and the average decline of 6 million pounds during March.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks decreased 56 million pounds during March to 353 million pounds on April 1. These holdings were 75 percent larger than a year earlier and 36 percent larger than average. Turkey holdings were 209 million pounds compared with 122 million on April 1, 1966 and average stocks of 152 million. Whole birds amounted to 174 million pounds and cut-ups, parts, and further processing items totaled 35 million pounds.

Frozen egg holdings were 45 million pounds, up 4 million from March 1. At this time last year stocks totaled 24 million and the average is 48 million pounds. Shell eggs in storage were down to 39 thousand cases from the 55 thousand held on March 1. April 1 stocks were 39 percent larger than year earlier holdings but 19 percent below average.
