## COLD STORAGE REPORT, MAY 1, 1967

### Commodity Summary

Cold storage inventories of butter, cheese, shell eggs, frozen eggs, orange concentrate, pork, and lamb and mutton increased during April but holdings of fresh and frozen fruits, vegetables, nuts, poultry, beef, and veal decreased, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Shell egg holdings totaled 99 thousand cases on May 1 -- 58 thousand more than a month earlier. Stocks were 42 thousand cases a year earlier and the average is 64 thousand. Frozen egg inventories of 54 million pounds compared with May 1, 1966 holdings of 33 million and the average of 61 million.

A 54-million pound decrease in holdings of frozen fruits during April lowered inventories to 364 million pounds on May 1, about the same as year earlier. Stocks were lower than the previous month for all kinds of fruits. May 1 inventories of frozen vegetables totaled 1,318 million pounds, 4 percent less than a month earlier but 11 percent above a year earlier. Asparagus, broccoli, and spinach holdings increased but inventories of other frozen vegetables decreased.

Orange concentrate stocks increased 6 million gallons during April. The 55 million gallons on hand on May 1 were 11 million more than average. The April increase was 2 million gallons more than the year earlier increase but the same as the average increase for the month.

Stocks of pork increased by 55 million pounds during April and totaled 386 million on May 1. The most significant rise was in frozen hams which increased by 24 million pounds during the month. Holdings of frozen loins decreased 1 million pounds. On May 1, 1966, pork in storage amounted to 272 million pounds and the average is 354 million. May 1 stocks of beef totaled 284 million pounds - 31 percent more than a year earlier and 44 percent above average.

### Public Warehouse Occupancy

May 1 occupancy of cooler rooms was 56 percent, unchanged from a month earlier. Occupancy was higher in the New England, East North Central, and Mountain regions but unchanged or lower in other regions. A year earlier, occupancy was 50 percent and the average is 54 percent.

Utilization of freezer space was 69 percent-the same as on April 1. Lower occupancy in the Mid-Atlantic, East South Central, Mountain and Pacific regions was offset by higher occupancy elsewhere. Occupancy was 58 percent last year on this date and the average is 66 percent.

### Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Warehouse stocks in cooler rooms decreased by 244 million pounds during April and totaled 2.0 billion pounds on May 1. Inventories were larger for fresh vegetables, cheese, shell eggs, beef, and canned meats, but smaller for fresh fruits, dried and evaporated fruits, nuts, and canned milk. The most significant decrease was in stocks of fresh apples, which declined 267 million pounds during the month.

Freezer-held commodities rose 27 million pounds to 4.1 billion on May 1. Declines in holdings of poultry, frozen fruits, vegetables, beef, veal, and lamb and mutton were more than offset by increases in other items during April.

### Fruits, Vegetables, and Juices

Stocks of frozen fruit totaled 364 million pounds on May 1, 54 million less than on April 1 but 54 million more than average. Stocks were about the same as on May 1, 1966. Holdings of all frozen fruit packs were lowered during April but the sharpest decline was in strawberries. A 17-million pound reduction brought May 1

holdings down to 96 million pounds, 4 million more than a year earlier and 18 million more than average. Reductions were principally in West Coast and West North Central warehouses. Slight gains were reported in the East and West South Central States.

Frozen vegetable holdings were down to 1,318 million pounds after a 57-million pound April decline. At this time last year, frozen vegetable stocks were 1,182 million pounds following an April decline of 34 million pounds. Average May 1 stocks are 966 million pounds and the average April disappearance is 34 million pounds.

Frozen orange concentrate holdings moved up 6 million gallons to 55 million, 37 percent more than year earlier stocks and 24 percent larger than average. May 1 stocks were about 2 million gallons short of the May 1 record 56 million gallons stored in 1965.

#### Dairy Products

May 1 stocks of creamery butter totaled 104 million pounds - 71 million pounds were Government owned. At this time last year, total stocks were 34 million pounds and the average is 231 million. Holdings were up in all sections of the country for a net April gain of 28 million pounds. This exceeded the average by 5 million pounds and the April 1966 gain by 19 million.

American cheese stored on May 1 amounted to 330 million pounds, up 12 million from April 1. This gain was half as much as in 1966 and 7 million short of average. Stocks were 27 percent above year earlier holdings and 4 percent above average.

#### Meat Products

Beef declined 16 million pounds in April to 284 million on May 1. These stocks were 31 percent above year earlier holdings and 44 percent above average. They also were the largest May 1 holdings since 1944.

Total pork in storage amounted to 386 million pounds, 55 million more than on April 1, 1967 and 114 million more than on May 1, 1966. Average holdings for the date are 354 million pounds. The 55-million April gain was the same as in 1966 but 22 million pounds larger than average.

Supplies of all meat totaled 776 million pounds compared with 585 million on May 1, 1966. Average holdings for the date are 667 million pounds. The April net disappearance of 49 million pounds was 8 million short of the April 1966 reduction but 14 million more than average.

#### Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks were down to 320 million pounds on May 1 after a 30-million pound April decline. This reduction was 2 million pounds short of the April 1966 decline and 5 million short of average. Total holdings were almost 90 percent larger than year earlier stocks and 42 percent larger than average. May 1 turkey holdings were 175 million pounds compared with 92 million on May 1, 1966. Average stocks are 122 million.

Shell eggs in storage on May 1 totaled 99 thousand cases, up from the 41 thousand on April 1. The April gain of 58 thousand cases exceeded the year earlier increase by 44 thousand cases and the average by 42 thousand.

Supplies of frozen eggs were 54 million pounds, two-thirds more than on May 1, 1966 but about one-tenth less than average.
