COLD STORAGE REPORT, OCTOBER 1, 1967

Commodity Summary

October 1 stocks of frozen poultry were at a record 589 million pounds, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Turkey stocks for the coming holidays also were at a new high, 427 million pounds. At this time last year, frozen poultry totaled 408 million pounds and turkeys, 283 million pounds.

Shell eggs were 281 thousand cases on October 1. The 98 million pounds of frozen eggs in storage were 85 percent above year earlier stocks but 2 percent below the October 1, 1961-65 average.

Holdings of butter were down 22 million pounds to 211 million. American cheese stocks were 384 million pounds, up 11 percent from October 1, 1966 but about average for the date.

Frozen vegetable stocks were up 265 million and totaled 1,698 million pounds on October 1. This was 13 percent more than the stocks a year earlier and 34 percent more than average.

Frozen fruits gained 10 million pounds during September and rose to 554 million on October 1. Year earlier holdings were 594 million pounds and the average is 577 million pounds.

Frozen orange concentrate stocks were reduced 15 million gallons leaving 54 million on October 1 compared with 31 million a year earlier. The September reduction was almost twice the September 1966 decline and $2\frac{1}{2}$ times the average.

Holdings of beef declined 8 million pounds to 237 million and stocks of pork moved up 4 million pounds to 203 million. Stocks of all meat were 527 million pounds compared with 451 million a year earlier. Average October 1 holdings are 439 million pounds.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

Occupancy of public freezer space increased 2 points during September to 79 percent on October 1 and utilization of cooler rooms remained at 61 percent-unchanged from a month earlier.

Year earlier total occupancy of freezer rooms was 70 percent and the average is 72 percent. The New England and South Atlantic regions had less freezer space occupied on October 1 than a month earlier but occupancy was higher in all other regions.

Last year 53 percent of U. S. cooler space was in use on October 1 and the average is 57 percent. Use of cooler space increased in the Mid-Atlantic and Mountain regions during September but was unchanged or lower in other regions.

Poultry and Poultry Products

October 1 warehouse stocks of frozen poultry were a record 589 million pounds, 44 percent more than a year earlier and 62 percent above the average. Frozen turkey stocks totaled 427 million pounds, a record high. A year earlier, stocks totaled 283 million pounds and the average is 246 million. The September gain of 95 million pounds was 9 million more than the average September increase of 86 million pounds.

Shell egg holdings were 281 thousand cases compared with 100 thousand a year earlier. The October 1 average is 212 thousand cases. Stocks were down 34 thousand cases for the month. Last year the September gain was 43 thousand cases. The average September change is a decrease of 44 thousand cases.

Frozen eggs totaled 98 million pounds, about the same as a month earlier. Last year, the September decline was 7 million pounds reducing October 1 stocks to 53 million pounds. The average reduction is 8 million pounds and the average October 1 stocks are 100 million pounds.

Dairy Products

Stocks of butter declined 22 million pounds to 211 million on October 1. Year

earlier holdings were 68 million pounds after a 17 million pound reduction. Average October 1 holdings are 267 million pounds. American cheese stocks on October 1 were 384 million pounds compared with 347 million a year earlier. Average holdings are 384 million pounds. The September decline in American cheese stocks was 13 million pounds, 11 million more than last year but 7 million short of average.

Meat and Meat Products

Total stocks of meat on October 1 were 527 million pounds. This was a September decline of 1 million pounds. A year earlier stocks increased 17 million pounds and holdings were 451 million pounds on October 1. The average change is a reduction of 27 million pounds and average holdings are 439 million pounds. Beef stocks were 237 million pounds, an 8 million pound decrease during September. Frozen pork totaled 203 million pounds, up 4 million from September 1.

Stocks of all pork were 34 percent larger than a year earlier and 29 percent larger than average.

Fruits, Juices and Vegetables

October 1 stocks of frozen fruits totaled 554 million pounds, 10 million more than a month earlier but 41 million less than a year earlier. Stocks of blackberries, blueberries, grapes, and peaches increased in September. Average holdings for October 1 are 577 million pounds.

Stocks of frozen orange concentrate declined 15 million gallons during September compared to an 8 million gallon decrease a year earlier and the average decrease of 6 million gallons. The October 1 inventory of 54 million gallons is 22 million more than for this date in 1966 and 19 million more than average.

October 1 frozen vegetable holdings totaled 1,698 million pounds, 265 million higher than a month earlier and 200 million above a year earlier. Average October 1 holdings are 1,265 million pounds. Stocks of frozen beans and corn rose sharply.
