Commodity Summary

Warehouse stocks of fresh apples, frozen fruit, frozen vegetables, poultry, and red meat increased during October, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Reduced during the month were stocks of fresh pears, orange concentrate, cream, butter, cheese, shell eggs and frozen eggs.

The November 1 inventory of fresh apples was 2.3 billion pounds compared with 2.5 billion a year earlier. Average November 1 stocks are 2.4 billion.

Frozen fruits gained 7 million pounds during October to total 552 million on November 1. Year earlier holdings were 614 million and the 1961-65 average is 570 million pounds.

A record 1.8 billion pounds of frozen vegetables were in storage on November 1. These stocks were 12 percent larger than on November 1, 1966 and 36 percent larger than average.

Also at a record high were the 551 million pounds of frozen turkeys. They exceeded year earlier stocks by 156 million pounds and the average by 194 million pounds. Holdings of total poultry were 720 million pounds, up 183 million from a year earlier and 231 million above average.

November 1 stocks of meat totaled 583 million pounds compared with 509 million at this time last year. Beef holdings rose 12 million during October to 255 million on November 1. Pork increased 41 million to 244 million pounds and other meats increased 1 million to 85 million pounds.

Stocks of frozen orange concentrate were down 13 million gallons during October to 41 million on November 1. These stocks were larger than both a year earlier and average.

Butter in storage was reduced 14 million pounds to 198 million. This was about three and one-half times the stocks of a year earlier. American cheese stocks were down to 373 million pounds after a 13 million-pound October drop.

November 1 stocks of shell eggs were 263 thousand cases compared with 48 thousand on November 1, 1966. The average is 179 thousand cases. Frozen eggs declined 2 million pounds to 98 million.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

Occupancy of public cooler space increased 4 points during October to 64 percent on November 1 and utilization of freezer rooms increased 1 point to 81 percent.

A year earlier occupancy of cooler rooms was 57 percent and the average is 60 percent. The New England, East North Central, and East South Central had lower occupancy of cooler space on November 1 compared with a month earlier but occupancy was unchanged or higher in other regions.

Last year 73 percent of the U. S. freezer space was in use on November 1 and the average is 75 percent. November 1 utilization was higher than a month earlier except in the New England, South Atlantic and East South Central regions.

Fruits, Juices, and Vegetables

November 1 stocks of frozen fruits totaled 552 million pounds, 7 million more than a month earlier but 62 million less than a year earlier. Stocks of apples, grapes, and peaches increased but inventories of most other commodities decreased. Average November 1 holdings of frozen fruits are 570 million pounds.

Stocks of frozen orange concentrate declined 13 million gallons during October compared with a 7 million-gallon decrease for both a year earlier and average. The November 1 inventory is 17 million gallons more than for this date in 1966 and 14 million more than average.

Frozen vegetable holdings totaled 1,837 million pounds on November 1 compared with 1,714 million a month earlier and 1,643 million a year earlier. Average November 1 holdings are 1,349 million pounds. Frozen asparagus, green peas, and spinach decreased during October but stocks of all other vegetables increased.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Stocks of frozen poultry were a record for the second consecutive month. November 1 holdings totaled 720 million pounds, 117 million above a month earlier and 183 million more than a year earlier. Average November 1 holdings are 489 million pounds. Holdings of frozen turkeys totaled 551 million pounds, 39 percent higher than on November 1, 1966 and 54 percent above average.

Stocks of shell eggs totaled 263 thousand cases, 20 thousand less than a month earlier but 215 thousand more than a year earlier and 84 thousand cases above average.

Frozen eggs declined 2 million pounds during October to 98 million on November 1. Last year the October decline was 7 million pounds and the average decline is 14 million.

Dairy Products

Stocks of butter declined 14 million pounds and totaled 198 million on November 1. At this time last year 58 million pounds were in storage after an October decline of 10 million pounds. The average reduction is 33 million pounds and average November 1 stocks are 234 million pounds. Government-owned butter totaled 163 million pounds compared with 177 million a month earlier. At this time last year Government butter totaled 733 thousand pounds and the average is 192 million pounds. American cheese stocks on November 1 were 373 million pounds compared with 336 million a year earlier. The 13-million pound decline in October was about equal to last year but was about half of average.

Meat and Meat Products

Total stocks of meat on November 1 were 583 million pounds. This was an October gain of 54 million pounds compared with 59 million a year earlier when stocks totaled 509 million pounds. The average October increase is 25 million pounds and average November 1 stocks are 464 million pounds. Beef totaled 255 million pounds, a 12-million pound gain from October 1. Total pork holdings were 244 million pounds compared with 171 million a year earlier and average. These stocks were the largest for the date since 1951. The 41 million pound October gain in pork was twice the October 1966 increase and almost three times the average.

Special Butterfat-Sugar Mix Survey

A second special survey was made of the amount of butterfat-sugar mix in storage. A total of 50,580,000 pounds was reported in storage on November 1 compared with 76,939,000 pounds on July 1. The July data were revised as the result of late reports. Stocks for November 1 include reports from all firms that reported for the July 1 survey. Regionally, the distribution of stocks on November 1 was 44 percent in Middle Atlantic warehouses, 27 percent in the South Atlantic, 8 percent in the West North Central and 7 percent in each of the East North Central and New England Regions. The remaining 7 percent was in other regions.
