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## COLD STORAGE REPORT, JANUARY 1, 1968

### Commodity Summary

Warehouse stocks of total meats, dried and evaporated fruits, and nuts increased during December but inventories of fresh and frozen vegetables, frozen fruits, juice, eggs, dairy products and poultry decreased, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

January 1 holdings of beef totaled 278 million pounds, 9 percent below a year earlier but 12 percent above the 1962-66 average. Stocks of pork totaled 287 million pounds compared with 234 million a year earlier and average holdings of 228 million.

Frozen turkeys declined 61 million pounds during December to 370 million on January 1. Stocks of frozen ducks also declined but holdings of broilers, roasters, and hens increased during December.

Orange concentrate stocks totaled 37 million gallons on January 1, nearly double the 19 million gallons on hand a year earlier. Average holdings are 23 million gallons.

Stocks of frozen apples increased during December but holdings of other frozen fruits decreased. Total frozen fruit holdings of 508 million pounds on January 1 were 8 percent less than a year earlier and 1 percent less than average. A December decline of 104 million pounds lowered January 1 holdings of frozen vegetables, excluding French Fries to 1,367 million pounds, 163 million more than a year earlier and 317 million above average.

Shell eggs in storage declined 65 thousand cases during December to 85 thousand on January 1. Frozen egg holdings declined 9 million pounds during December and totaled 87 million on January 1.

### Public Warehouse Occupancy

Occupancy of public cooler rooms decreased 2 points during December to 60 percent on January 1. A year earlier occupancy was 56 percent and the average is 57 percent. Utilization of cooler space increased 1 point in the West South Central region in December but was unchanged or lower elsewhere.

Public freezer occupancy of 75 percent on January 1 was 4 points less than a month earlier but 4 points above both a year earlier and average. Utilization of freezer rooms was lower than a month earlier in all regions.

### Cooler & Freezer Stock Changes

Cooler held stocks totaled 3.0 billion pounds on January 1 compared with 3.6 billion a month earlier. Declines during December were reported for apples, pears, fresh vegetables, cheese, eggs, beef, pork; and canned meats. Stocks of dried and evaporated fruits and nuts increased during December.

Freezer stocks declined 196 million pounds during December to 4.7 billion on January 1. Stocks of butter, cream, eggs, poultry, fruits, juices, and vegetables declined but holdings of meats increased.

### Fruits, Vegetables, and Juices

Beginning of the year stocks of frozen fruits were 508 million pounds, 8 percent less than on January 1, 1967 and 1 percent less than average. Stocks were reduced 30 million pounds during December, 2 million short of the December 1966 disappearance and 1 million less than average. Except for the 12 million pound gain in stocks of frozen apples, there was a reduction in stocks of all frozen fruit packs. Stocks of frozen strawberries had the sharpest drop. A 17-million pound reduction left 146 million in storage on January 1 compared with 155 million last year and the average of 145 million pounds.

Stocks of french fries were up to 386 million pounds following a December gain of 19 million pounds. These stocks were 6 percent below a year earlier but 66 percent above average for January 1.

Holdings of frozen vegetables, excluding french fries, were 1,367 million pounds on January 1. At this time last year, stocks totaled 1,204 million pounds and the average is 1,050 million pounds. During December, stocks declined 104 million pounds, 13 million more than a year earlier and 23 million more than average.

January 1 orange concentrate stocks of 37 million gallons were about the same as a month earlier but double the stocks of a year earlier. Average holdings for the date are 23 million gallons.

#### Dairy Products

January 1, 1968 stocks of total butter were 171 million pounds compared with 32 million a year earlier and the 1962-66 average of 174 million pounds. Stocks declined 15 million pounds during December. Government-owned butter, reduced by 13 million, totaled 148 million pounds on January 1, 1968.

Stocks of American cheese declined 4 percent during December to 341 million pounds. At this time last year, 322 million pounds were in storage, and average January 1 holdings are 332 million pounds. Government-owned cheese was down 2 million pounds to 39 million, 7 million more than average.

#### Meat Products

A 5-percent gain in frozen pork holdings in December brought January 1 warehouse holdings up to 257 million pounds. Stocks were larger for all frozen pork cuts except hams, which declined 45 percent to 28 million pounds. The largest gain was in pork bellies which totaled 70 million pounds on January 1, 1968. This was 21 million more than a month earlier and 25 million more than a year earlier.

Stocks of dry salt pork were up slightly from a month earlier but a reduction in other pork cuts more than offset these gains. Total cooler pork was down 13 percent to 30 million pounds.

Frozen beef holdings were up 11 million pounds from December 1, and totaled 266 million at the beginning of this year. These stocks were 26 million short of year earlier supplies but 33 million larger than average.

Holdings of veal, lamb and mutton, moved up slightly but canned ham stocks dropped 9 million pounds to 35 million. Other canned meats were up 2 million to 23 million pounds.

#### Poultry and Poultry Products

January 1 stocks of frozen poultry were 548 million pounds compared with 437 million last year and the average of 360 million pounds. The December 1967 decline of 61 million pounds was average for the month but about double the December 1966 disappearance. Frozen turkeys stored on January 1 were 370 million pounds, about 100 million pounds more than a year earlier and 150 million more than average.

Shell egg holdings were down to 85 thousand cases after a 65-thousand case decline in December. January 1 stocks were more than 3 times the holdings of a year earlier and 15 percent larger than average.

Frozen egg holdings totaled 87 million pounds, 9 million less than a month earlier. Holdings on January 1, 1967 were 36 million pounds and average holdings are 57 million pounds. The December 1967 decline of 9 million pounds was 6 million larger than last year but 3 million less than average.
