COLD STORAGE REPORT JUNE 1, 1968

Changes During Past Month

Stocks of pork, shell eggs, frozen eggs, cream, cheese, butter, orange juice and strawberries increased during May, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Stocks of poultry, beef, fresh and frozen fruit, and most frozen vegetables declined.

Inventories of all meats increased 7 million pounds during May. Shell eggs were up 103 thousand cases while total frozen eggs increased 12 million pounds. Total cheese holdings were up 32 million pounds and butter was 17 million higher. Orange juice increased 120 million pounds.

Declines were recorded during May as follows: turkeys 21 million pounds, beef 20 million, and frozen french fries 32 million.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

June 1 occupancy of cooler rooms at 60 percent was 1 point higher than a month earlier and was 10 points above a year earlier and 6 points above the June 1 average. Occupancy was above or the same as a month earlier in all regions except the Mountain and Pacific regions where cooler occupancy declined.

Occupancy of freezer rooms on June 1 was 66 percent, up 4 points from May 1 and 9 points above a year earlier. Utilization compared with a month earlier was the same in the West South Central Region. Occupancy was lower in all other regions.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Cooler-held stocks decreased by 189 million pounds during May and on June 1 totaled 1,551 million pounds. This is 13 percent below a year earlier. Reductions in fresh fruits and vegetables more than offset increases in shell eggs, cheese, and butter.

Stocks in freezer rooms totaled 3,969 million pounds on June 1, down 32 million from May 1. The June 1, 1967 freezer stocks totaled 4,000 pounds. Decreases in frozen poultry, beef, fruit and vegetables offset increases in frozen eggs, pork and orange juice.

Meat Products

Stocks of meat totaled 669 million pounds, 7 million above a month earlier. This compares with June 1 stocks of 725 million pounds a year earlier and average stocks of 656 million. Pork holdings increased 29 million pounds during May to 384 million. Frozen pork bellies at 132 million pounds increased 14 percent during May, compared with a 2 percent decrease during May 1967. Frozen pork butts at 9 million pounds increased 19 percent during the month. Beef stocks totaled 195 million pounds on June 1 compared with month-earlier holdings of 215 million and year-earlier holdings of 288 million.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks decreased 27 million pounds during May to 324 million pounds, 10 percent more than a year earlier and 70 percent above average. Turkey holdings were 204 million pounds compared with 225 million pounds on May 1, 1968. The June holdings were more than double the average for the date. On June 1 whole birds amounted to 174 million pounds while parts, cut ups, and further processing items totaled 30 million.

Frozen egg holdings were 98 million pounds, up 12 million pounds from May 1. Year-earlier stocks totaled 71 million. Shell eggs in storage were up seasonally to 205 thousand cases from 102 thousand on May 1. June 1 stocks were 60 thousand cases below year-earlier holdings and were 12 thousand cases below average.

Dairy Products

Supplies of creamery butter in refrigerated storage totaled 197 million pounds on June 1 compared with 151 million a year earlier and average stocks of 237 million pounds. The May gain of 17 million pounds compared with 41 million a year earlier and an average gain of 24 million. Government-owned butter on June 1 totaled 164 million pounds, up 9 million from a month earlier.

American cheese holdings were 343 million pounds, down 12 million from a year earlier but 13 million above average. The May increase of 28 million pounds compared with a 20 million pound gain a year earlier and an average May gain of 26 million.

Fruits, Juices, and Vegetables

Holdings of orange concentrate were 50 million gallons, up 12 million from a month earlier compared with the average increase of 8 million gallons during May. The June 1 holdings were 27 percent below a year earlier and 6 percent below average.

Frozen fruit totaled 306 million pounds on June 1, compared with 343 million a month earlier and 323 million a year earlier. Inventories of all fruit items except strawberries decreased during May. Stocks of strawberries were 84 million pounds, 15 percent below a year earlier but 5 percent above the average for June 1.

Fresh apple holdings were 110 million pounds compared with 281 million a month earlier and 191 million a year earlier. Fresh pears totaled only 1 thousand boxes compared with 24 thousand a month earlier and 25 thousand a year earlier.

Frozen vegetable stocks declined 114 million pounds during May to 1,357 million pounds. The total was 5 percent above June 1 a year earlier and 43 percent above average. Holdings of frozen vegetables (excluding french fries) totaled 888 million pounds, 8 percent below a month earlier. Year-earlier stocks totaled 791 million pounds. Increases during May in inventories of asparagus and broccoli were more than offset by lower stocks of other vegetable items. French fries totaled 470 million pounds, 32 million less than on May 1. Year-earlier stocks totaled 499 million pounds.

COLD STORAGE REPORT JUNE 1, 1968

Changes During Past Month

Paragraphs 2 and 3:

Inventories of all meats decreased 5 million pounds during May. Shell eggs were up 103 thousand cases while total frozen eggs increased 12 million pounds. Total cheese holdings were up 32 million pounds and butter was 17 million higher. Orange juice increased 120 million pounds.

Declines were recorded during May as follows: turkeys 29 million pounds, beef 20 million, and frozen french fries 32 million.

Meat Products

Paragraph 1:

Stocks of meat totaled 657 million pounds, 5 million below a month earlier. This compares with June 1 stocks of 725 million pounds a year earlier and average stocks of 659 million. Pork holdings increased 25 million pounds during May to 380 million. Frozen pork bellies at 128 million pounds increased 11 percent during May, compared with a 2 percent decrease during May 1967. Frozen pork butts at 9 million pounds increased 19 percent during the month. Beef stocks totaled 195 million pounds on June 1 compared with month-earlier holdings of 215 million and year-earlier holdings of 288 million.

Poultry and Poultry Products

Paragraph 1:

Frozen poultry stocks decreased 35 million pounds during May to 315 million pounds, 1 percent more than a year earlier and 66 percent above average. Turkey holdings were 196 million pounds compared with 225 million pounds on May 1, 1968. The June holdings were more than double the average for the date. On June 1 whole birds amounted to 167 million pounds while parts, cut ups, and further processing items totaled 29 million.
