COLD STORAGE REPORT JULY 1, 1968

Changes During Past Month

Stocks of butter, cheese, eggs, orange juice, strawberries, and peas increased during June, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Stocks of turkey, pork, and french fries declined.

Butter holdings were up 26 million pounds, while American cheese was up 29 million pounds. Shell eggs increased 87 thousand cases during June. Frozen eggs increased 11 million pounds. Orange juice increased 63 million pounds and strawberries were up 90 million pounds. Frozen peas increased 73 million pounds.

Inventories of all meat declined 68 million pounds during June, mostly because of reduced pork holdings. Turkeys declined 10 million pounds, and frozen french fries dropped 88 million.

Public Warehouse Occupancy

July 1 occupancy of cooler rooms at 62 percent was 2 points higher than a month earlier and a year earlier, and 7 points above the July 1 average. Occupancy was above or the same as a month earlier in all but the East South Central and Mountain Regions. Occupancy of freezer rooms on July 1 was 67 percent, up 1 point from June 1, and 3 points above average but 4 points below a year earlier. Utilization compared with a month earlier was higher in the mid-Atlantic and Pacific regions. All other regions were the same or lower.

Cooler and Freezer Stock Changes

Cooler-held stocks decreased by 111 million pounds during June and on July 1 totaled 1,448 million pounds. This is 11 percent below a year earlier. Reductions from a month earlier in apples, fresh vegetables and other cooler items more than offset increases in shell eggs, cheese and butter.

Stocks in freezer rooms totaled 4,029 million pounds on July 1, up 57 million from June 1. The July 1, 1967 freezer stocks totaled 4,336 million pounds. Increases in frozen strawberries, orange juice, green peas, and eggs offset decreases in frozen poultry, pork and most other vegetables.

Meat Products

Stocks of meat totaled 606 million pounds, 68 million less than a month earlier. This compares with year earlier stocks of 664 million pounds and average stocks of 595 million. Pork holdings decreased 66 million pounds during June to 322 million. Frozen pork bellies at 102 million pounds decreased 22 percent during June, compared with an 11 percent decrease during June 1967. Other pork items shared in the decrease in pork holdings during June. Beef stocks totaled 193 million pounds on July 1 compared with month-earlier holdings of 194 million and year-earlier holdings of 276 million.

### Poultry and Poultry Products

Frozen poultry stocks decreased 17 million pounds during June to 295 million pounds. This was 4 percent less than a year earlier but 62 percent above average. Turkey holdings were 185 million pounds compared with 194 million pounds last month. The July 1 holdings were more than double the average for the date. Whole turkeys totaled 156 million pounds, while parts, cut ups, and further processing items totaled 28 million.

Shell eggs in storage were up seasonally to 278 thousand cases from 191 thousand on June 1. July 1 stocks were 149 thousand cases below year-earlier holdings and 22 thousand cases below average. Frozen egg holdings were 106 million pounds, up 11 million from June 1. Year-earlier stocks totaled 85 million.

### Dairy Products

Supplies of creamery butter in refrigerated storage totaled 226 million pounds on July 1 compared with 192 million a year earlier and average stocks of 272 million pounds. The June gain was 26 million pounds, below the 40-million pound gain a year earlier and the average gain of 35 million. Government-owned butter on July 1 totaled 184 million pounds, up 17 million from a month earlier.

American cheese holdings were 370 million pounds, down 15 million from a year earlier but 6 million above average. The June increase of 29 million pounds was the same as during June 1967 but below the average gain of 34 million.

### Fruits, Juices, and Vegetables

Holdings of orange concentrate were 56 million gallons, 6 million above a month earlier compared with a June 1967 gain of 19 million. The holdings were down 36 percent from a year earlier but 7 percent above average.

Frozen fruit totaled 394 million pounds on July 1, compared with 316 million a month earlier and 386 million a year earlier. Strawberry holdings were up seasonally to 179 million pounds, 6 percent below a year earlier but 11 percent above the July 1 average. Holdings of frozen apricots, blackberries, boysenberries and red raspberries also increased during June.

Fresh apple holdings declined to 35 million pounds on July 1 compared with 111 million a month earlier and 49 million a year earlier.

Frozen vegetable stocks declined 40 million pounds during June to 1,323 million pounds. This was 9 percent above July 1 a year earlier and 43 percent above average. Holdings of frozen vegetables (excluding french fries) totaled 941 million pounds, 5 percent above a month earlier. Year-earlier stocks totaled 809 million pounds. Increases during June in inventories of asparagus, broccoli and green peas were more than offset by lower stocks of other vegetable items. French fries totaled 382 million pounds, 88 million less than on June 1. Year-earlier stocks totaled 403 million pounds.
