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COLD STORAGE HIGHLIGHTS, FEBRUARY 28, 1989

Frozen stocks in refrigerated warehouses on February 28, 1989 were greater than year earlier levels for butter, pork, juice concentrates, frozen eggs, and fruits, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Cooler items with stocks above those of the previous year included dried and evaporated fruits, and fresh vegetables.

Total red meats in freezers increased 2 percent from January and were 10 percent more than those on February 29, 1988. Frozen pork stocks rose 4 percent during the month and were 28 percent above the previous year. Stocks of pork bellies were up 4 percent from last month and were 83 percent above 1988.

Total frozen poultry supplies decreased 2 percent from January and were 18 percent below last year. Total stocks of chickens declined 6 percent during the month and were 19 percent below 1988. Total pounds of turkeys in freezers was up 1 percent from last month but down 18 percent from last year.

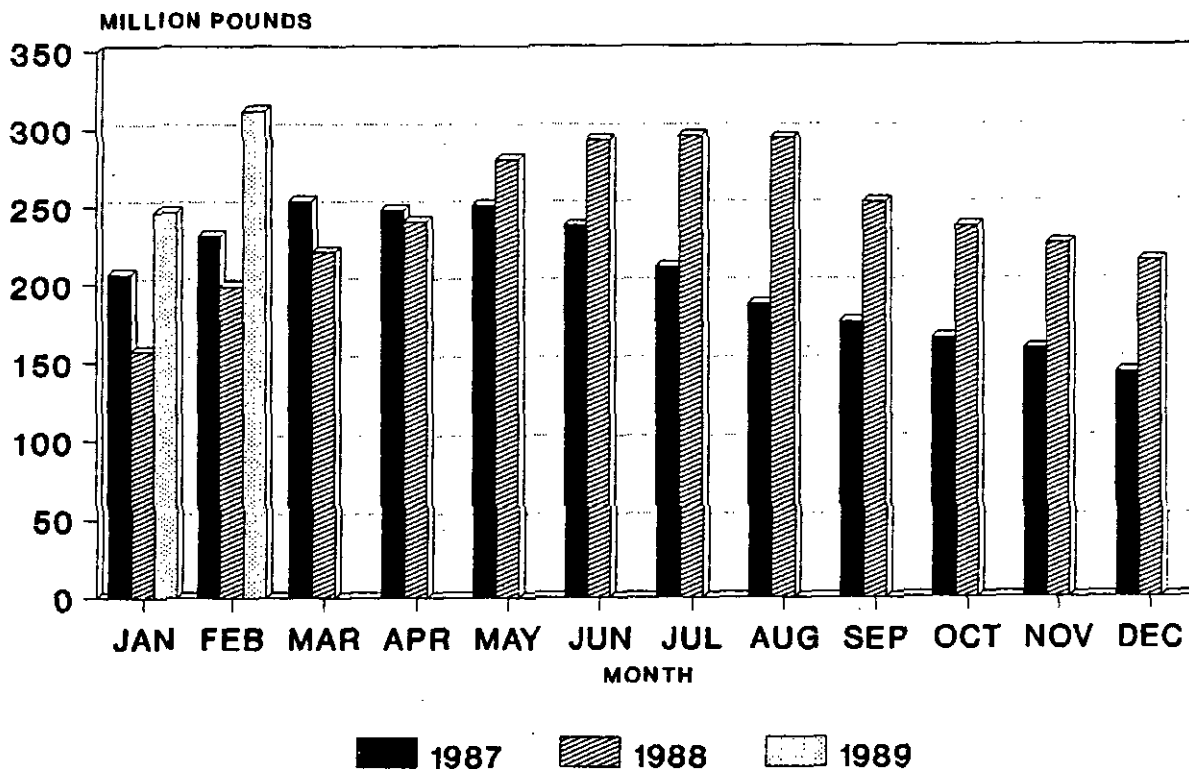

OCCUPANCY: Public cooler occupancy was at 51 percent of capacity, 2 points below January. Public freezer occupancy at 64 percent was 1 point below last month and 3 points below last year.
