VEGETABLES FOR COMMERCIAL PROCESSING

PLANTED ACREAGE OF PRINCIPAL CROPS

BY STATES

1951, 1952 AND 1953

The Crop Reporting Board of the Agricultural Marketing Service makes the following report of 1951, 1952 and 1953 planted acreage of the 11 principal vegetables for commercial processing, based on reports and data furnished by commercial processors, field statisticians, and cooperating agencies. This report supplements the "1952 Annual Summary, Vegetables for Commercial Processing," Report TC-52: 1233-1246, and the "1953 Annual Summary, Vegetables for Commercial Processing," Report TC-53: 1235-1248. The planted acreages shown in the following tables are comparable with the harvested acreages given in the 1952 and 1953 Annual Summaries.

Harvested acreage, as published in the 1952 and 1953 Annual Summaries, is that acreage brought successfully to maturity which was either completely or partially harvested.

Planted acreage, as shown in this report, consists of the harvested acreage plus any acreage lost or abandoned either before or after reaching maturity. Acreage lost but replanted for harvest in the same season is counted only once. For a perennial crop, such as asparagus, the planted acreage does not include non-bearing acreage planted for harvest during some future marketing season.

Planted acreage figures for the years 1930-50 are shown in Statistical Bulletin No. 132, "Vegetables for Commercial Processing, Revised Estimates, 1918-50." Planted acreage estimates for processing vegetables are not available for years prior to 1930.
