Bureau of the Census Cotton Information

Cotton consumed during the month ending June 30, 1992, amounted to 882,009 bales. Cotton on hand in consuming establishments at the end of June was 641,587 bales, and the total in public storage and in compresses was 3,726,246 bales. The number of active consuming cotton spindles was 3,742,000. The quantity of domestic cotton exported, excluding linters, was 563,600 bales. These and other data were published in "Census Bulletin M22P(92)-6", dated July 29, 1992.
