Received by Farmers  
and Value of Production**

**NOTE:** Changes in the issuance dates for noncitrus fruit and nut statistics were announced by the U. S. Department of Agriculture in October 1973. Production and value data on non-citrus fruits and nuts for the United States are contained in this report. Similar data by States were published in a new report entitled Noncitrus Fruits and Nuts, Annual Summary released January 14, 1974.

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**CROP VALUES**

Season Average Prices and Value of Production, by States, 1971, 1972, and 1973

Estimated season average prices and value of production for all major farm crops and for many minor crops are presented in this report. The season average prices are estimates of the average prices received by producers for that part of the crop that is sold. For wheat, rye, oats, and barley, the 1973 price estimates are based on mid-month price levels through November with an allowance for marketings for the remainder of the season. For all other crops 1973 price estimates are based on mid-month price levels through December with an allowance for marketings for the remainder of the season. These prices are applied to the production estimates to compute the value of production for each State. The United States value of production is the sum of the State values.

U. S. average prices are obtained by weighting State prices by estimated State sales for each crop year. These averages may differ from the averages computed by dividing value of production by the quantity produced. The value of production estimates in this report relate to the crop year and should not be confused with cash receipts which relate to sales during a calendar year, irrespective of the year of production. All estimates for the 1973 crop are preliminary. Final prices for 1971, 1972 and 1973 crops will be published in the May 1974 Field Crops Report.

For crops for which monthly price estimates are prepared, State season average prices are computed by weighting mid-month prices by estimated monthly marketings. For most other crops the season average price is based on special survey data. The season average prices include an allowance for unredeemed CCC loans and purchase agreement deliveries valued at average loan rate, by States, for crops under these programs. Season average prices and values of production including support payments are also shown for corn, all wheat, sorghum grain, barley and cotton lint.
