CROP VALUES

SEASON AVERAGE PRICES AND VALUE OF PRODUCTION, BY STATES, 1980, 1981, 1982

Season average prices and value of production for all major farm crops and for many special crops are presented in this report. Estimates formerly included in this report, but which have been discontinued include all seed crops, maple sirup, popcorn, dry edible peas, wrinkled seed peas, bushberries, and selected vegetables for fresh market and processing. The season average prices are for that part of the crop that is or will be sold by producers during the marketing year.

Preliminary season average price estimates for 1982 are based on entire month price averages through November for wheat, corn for grain, sorghum for grain, oats, barley, soybeans, flaxseed, peanuts, rice, potatoes, dry edible beans and sunflower with an allowance for marketings the remainder of the marketing year. Upland cotton season average prices are for the marketing year through December 31, 1982, based on entire month averages through November and the preliminary December price. Tobacco season average prices are estimates for the entire crop, except types 22, 23, 32, 41, 42, 51, 52, 55, and 61 for 1982 which have insufficient sales and were valued the same as the previous year. Fruit and vegetable season average prices are based on entire month prices. Citrus fruit prices are averages of entire month prices for the season ending in the calendar year specified in the heading of the table. Prices for other commodities, for which monthly price estimates are available, are based on mid-month prices through December with an allowance for marketings the remainder of the marketing year. For other crops without monthly price estimates, the season average price is based on special survey data. All estimates for 1982 crops are preliminary. Season average prices for 1980 and 1981 include an allowance for unredeemed CCC loans and purchase agreement deliveries, if any, valued at average loan and purchase rates by states, for crops under these programs. Season average prices do not include deficiency payments or disaster payments.

Season average prices are applied to production estimates to compute value of production for each state. The United States value of production is the sum of state values. Value of production estimates in this report relate to the crop year and should not be confused with cash receipts which relate to sales during a calendar year, irrespective of the year of production.
