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AUGUST 1984 HIGHLIGHTS

Butter production was 70.6 million pounds (32.0 thousand metric tons), 17 percent below August 1983 and 3 percent below July 1984.

American type cheese production totaled 207 million pounds (93.7 thousand metric tons), 10 percent below both August last year and July 1984.

Total cheese output (excluding cottage cheese) during August was 368 million pounds (167 thousand metric tons), 3 percent below August 1983 and 5 percent below July 1984.

Creamed cottage cheese production was 65.8 million pounds (29.8 thousand metric tons), 2 percent below August 1983 but 3 percent above July 1984.

Lowfat cottage cheese production was 20.8 million pounds (9440 metric tons), 7 percent above both August 1983 and July 1984.

Canned evaporated and condensed whole milk production, at 53.7 million pounds (24.4 thousand metric tons), was down 5 percent from August 1983 and was 1 percent below July 1984.

Frozen desserts: (Comparisons with August 1983)

Ice cream -- 86.5 million gallons (327 million liters), down 5 percent.

Ice milk -- 33.2 million gallons (126 million liters), up 1 percent.

Sherbet -- 4.78 million gallons (18.1 million liters), down 7 percent.

Dry milk products: (Comparisons with August 1983)

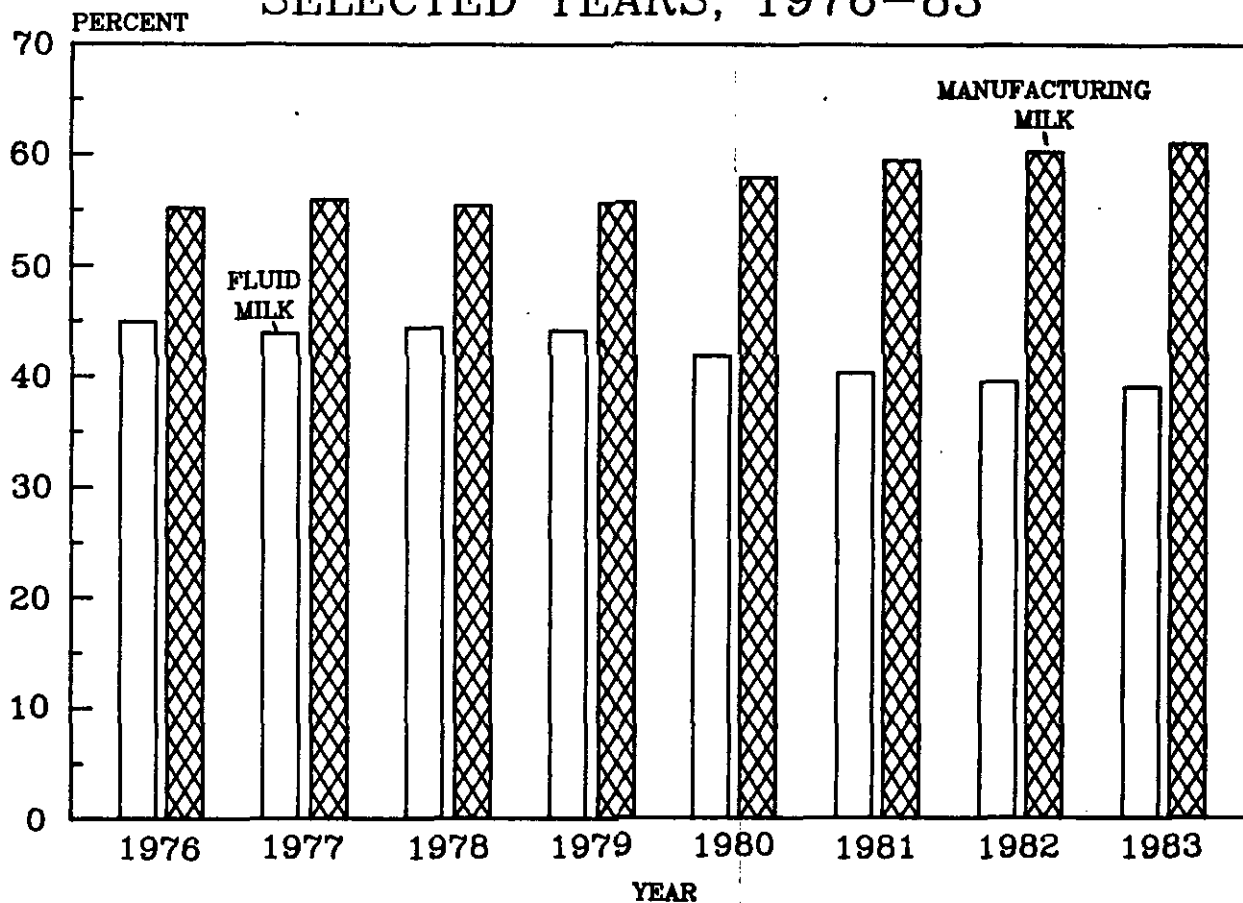
Nonfat dry milk for human food -- 88.1 million pounds (40.0 thousand metric tons), down 30 percent.

Dry whole milk -- 8.33 million pounds (3780 metric tons), down 10 percent.

Dry buttermilk -- 2.57 million pounds (1160 metric tons), up 1 percent.
