MAY 1985 HIGHLIGHTS

Butter production was 113 million pounds (51.2 thousand metric tons), 7 percent above May 1984 and 2 percent above April 1985.

American type cheese production totaled 271 million pounds (123 thousand metric tons), 3 percent above May 1984 and 8 percent above April 1985.

Total cheese output (excluding cottage cheese) during May was 451 million pounds (205 thousand metric tons), 4 percent above May 1984 and 6 percent above April 1985.

Creamed cottage cheese production was 67.1 million pounds (30.4 thousand metric tons), 3 percent above May 1984 and 6 percent above April 1985.

Lowfat cottage cheese production was 23.1 million pounds (10.5 thousand metric tons), 12 percent above May 1984 and 9 percent above April 1985.

Canned evaporated and condensed whole milk production was 61.8 million pounds (28.0 thousand metric tons), 2 percent below May 1984 but 4 percent above April 1985.

Frozen desserts: (Comparisons with May 1984)

Ice cream -- 83.7 million gallons (317 million liters), up 1 percent.

Ice milk -- 33.6 million gallons (127 million liters), up 10 percent.

Sherbet -- 4.94 million gallons (18.7 million liters), up 14 percent.

Dry milk products: (Comparisons with May 1984)

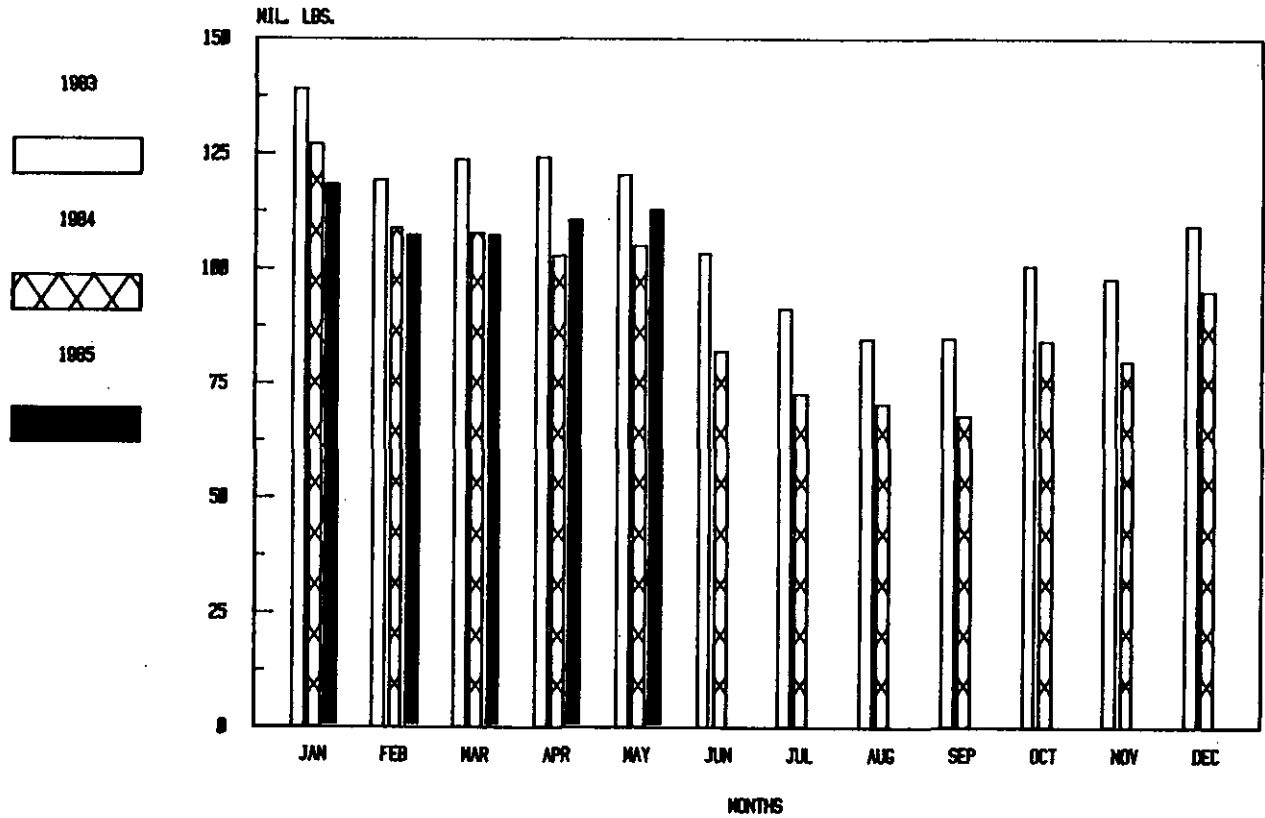
Nonfat dry milk for human food -- 140 million pounds (63.4 thousand metric tons), up 11 percent.

Dry whole milk -- 13.1 million pounds (5940 metric tons), up 24 percent.

Dry buttermilk -- 3.86 million pounds (1750 metric tons), down 4 percent.
