## FEBRUARY 1990 HIGHLIGHTS

**BUTTER** production was 116 million pounds in February, 7 percent below February 1989 and 9 percent below January 1990.

**AMERICAN TYPE CHEESE** production totaled 240 million pounds, 15 percent above February 1989 and 4 percent above January 1990.

**TOTAL CHEESE** output (excluding cottage cheese) was 472 million pounds, 12 percent above February 1989 but 2 percent below January 1990.

**CREAMED COTTAGE CHEESE** production was 43.9 million pounds 6 percent below February 1989 but virtually unchanged from January 1990.

**LOWFAT COTTAGE CHEESE** production was 24.4 million pounds, 1 percent above February 1989 and 2 percent above January 1990.

**CANNED EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED WHOLE MILK**, at 46.0 million pounds was 11 percent above February 1989 and 6 percent above January 1990.

**FROZEN DESSERTS:** (Comparisons with February 1989)  
Ice cream (Hard) -- 56.3 million gallons, down 5 percent.  
Ice milk -- 25.8 million gallons, up 7 percent.  
Sherbet (Hard) -- 3.28 million gallons, down 5 percent.

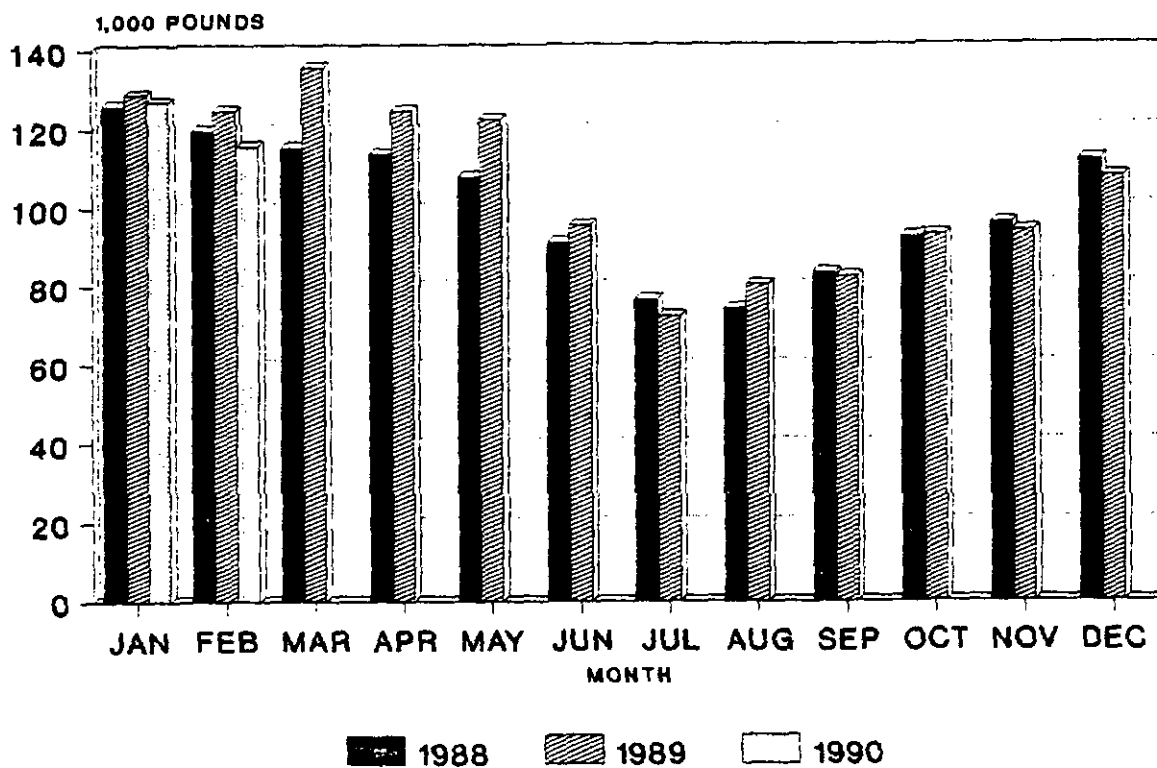
**DRY MILK PRODUCTS:** (Comparisons with February 1989)  
Nonfat dry milk for human food -- 71.2 million pounds, down 17 percent.  
Dry whole milk -- 12.9 million pounds, down 7 percent.  
Dry buttermilk -- 5.10 million pounds, down 11 percent.
