CAN NED MILK MARKETS STEADY TO FIRM - PRODUCTION AND STOCKS EIGHTER THAN YEAR AGO

THE CONDITION OF THE CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS DURING SEPTEMBER IS INDICATE FAVORABLE MOVEMENT INTO TRADE REPORTED AS STEADY TO FIRM. WHILE CONDITIONS ARE STILL FAVORABLE, DEMAND HAS OF DECREASED PRODUCTION. IT IS SIGNIFI-DROPPED SLIGHTLY AND SOME OF THE FIRMNESS CANT TO NOTE THAT UNSOLD STOCKS IN THE SEEN A MONTH AGO IS ABSENT. OFFERINGS HAVE BEEN A LITTLE FREER, BUT THERE HAS APPARENTLY BEEN NO WATERIAL CHANGES IN THE PRICES AT WHICH GOODS HAVE CHANGED HANDS, SINCE THE MIDDLE OF AUGUST.

TOTAL STOCKS IN THE HANDS OF MANU-FACTUREPS_ON SEPTEMBER | WERE 212,168,960 POUNDS. THIS FIGURE IS INTERESTING IN THAT POUNDS. THIS FIGURE IS INTERESTING IN THAT
IT REPRESENTS A DECREASE FROM A MONTH
EARLIER, WHEREAS THE MORE NORMAL CHANGE
DURING THESE MONTHS IS AN INCREASE. IT
ALSO IS MATERIALLY LOWER THAN THE FIVE-YEAR
AVERAGE FOR SEPTEMBER, AND THE AMOUNT BY
WHICH IT FAILS TO E UAL THIS FIGURE IS GREATER THAN A SIMILAR COMPARISON A MONTH

THIS DECREASE IN STOCKS SEEMS TO CHANNELS, BUT IT IS ALSO A REFLECTION HANDS OF MANUFACTURERS ARE REPORTED AS CONSIDERABLY LIGHTER THAN A YEAR AGO IN THE CASE GOODS CLASSES, BUT SOMEWHAT HIGHER FOR BULK PACKED PRODUCT.

PRODUCTION IN AUGUST CONTINUED
THE TREND OF THE PREVIOUS MONTHS. THAT
IS IT WAS CONSIDERABLY BELOW THE LEVEL
OF AUGUST 1927. THE DECREASE IS
INDICATED AS ABOUT 7%, SOMEWHAT LESS OF

EVAPORATED PRODUCTION WAS SOMEWHAT MORE MARKED THAN ELSEWHERE. THIS MAY INDICATE SOME TENDENCY FOR SHIFTING OF MILK SUPPLIES FROM THE CONDENSERIES TO THEESE FACTORIES, ON ACCOUNT OF FAVOR-ABLE PRICES PREVAILING AT THAT TIME. CONDITIONS WERE ALSO FAVORABLE FOR THE USE OF FLUID MILK AND CREAM AND IT MAY YELL BE THAT MORE THAN THE USUAL YMOUNTS WERE SENT INTO THESE CHANNELS. PRODUCTION SINCE SEPTEMBER 1. IT WILL E INTERESTING TO NOTE WHETHER OF NOT CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK WILL SHOW

TO HAVE OCCURRED IN THE CASES OF BOTH

ABOUT THE USUAL FOREIGN TPADE WAS REPORTED FOR AUGUST. EXPORTS OF CONDENSED WERE 3,246,350 LBS., AND OF EVAPORATED 6,342,516 LBS.; COMPARING WITH 3,531,725 AND 4,238,882 LBS. FOR AUGUST 1927. FROM THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR TO THE END OF AUGUST EXPORTS WERE 26,461,065 POUNDS OF CONDENSED AND 54,845,098 LBS. OF EVAPORATED. FOR 1927 THE COMPARABLE FIGURES WERE 24,456,765 AND 49,367,037 POUNDS. WHILE THIS REPRESENTS AN INCREASE IT IS BUT A FRACTION OF THE BUSINESS DONE IN DOMESTIC
