## FARM WORK CONTINUES ON WINTER SCHEDULE WORKER NUMBERS AT NEW FEBRUARY LOW

The number of persons working on the Nation's farms during the February survey week, at 4,750,000, was 5 percent less than a year earlier and smallest of record for the month by the same percentage. Northern and Central States remained on a winter schedule featuring livestock care, routine farmstead chores, and advance preparations for spring work. South Atlantic and South Central regions had prolonged cold or wet weather in February, which delayed field work and required fewer workers than usually needed at this period for work on some of the Nation's earliest crop activities.

The seasonal slowness had sharpest impact on the number of hired workers needed, reducing the total number of hired workers in the survey week of February 16-22 to 887,000 persons. This was 12 percent below the previous low for February reported in 1963. Reductions in number of hired workers from last year's February force were of most importance in South Atlantic and West South Central States and in California.

Farm operators and other family members working on the home farms represented even more than the usual dominant part of the February working force. The total of 3,863,000 family workers, however, was 3 percent under a year earlier, continuing the downward trend associated with decreased farm numbers in most States.

### Annual Review Provides Revised 1963 Estimates

The monthly estimates of farm employment for 1963 published throughout that year have been re-examined by statisticians in State offices to utilize information or appraisals possible in a careful review of the reports for the entire season. The monthly

estimates and annual averages shown on pages 5, 6, and 7 of this report include a considerable number of revisions in State estimates in certain months, which should improve accuracy of comparisons with State monthly estimates to be published in 1964. Although this is a new step in the farm employment estimates, it parallels procedures used in most other SRS series of periodic estimates. Plans for future work include this type of review and revision at the end of each year. The revisions for 1963, although of importance for certain States in different months, produced only small changes in State annual averages and virtually no change in the National averages previously published.

Alaska Farm Employment Estimates - 1963

Surveys made by the Statistical Reporting Service in Alaska during 1963 make possible the publication of estimates of farm employment for survey weeks in five months as shown below.
