WORKER NUMBERS BELOW YEAR AGO WAGE RATES GAIN

Farm work in the survey week June 21-27 employed 7,457,000 persons. Although this force represented a seasonal upturn of more than a tenth from the previous month, it was 4 percent smaller than a year earlier and lowest of record for the end of June. The 2,398,000 hired workers were 6 percent less than a year earlier. Wage rates reported for their efforts on July 1 averaged 3 percent higher than on the same date last year, and reached new record levels in almost all States. Farm family members contributed 5,059,000 persons to the work force for the week. This number--over two-thirds of the total farm force--was about 3 percent less than a year earlier.

The number of farm workers in the first six monthly survey periods of this year (January-June) has averaged 5.8 million persons. This is 5 percent under last year and 12 percent less than the 1958-62 average for the same period. Total farm production prospects have been well supported by this smaller force, promising adequate to large fall crops as well as supplying plentiful and regular current offerings of milk, meat, and seasonal specialties. The progress of farm work to the end of June has been satisfactory with a general sufficiency of farm labor reported despite limited shortages in some situations.

Farm Wage Rates Reported Higher in Most Areas

Farm wage rates have continued to move upward generally as jobs for dependable workers were filled. The average on July 1, 1964 computed from all reported rates was 3 percent above a year earlier and a new high for the date. The composite average of \$0.897 per hour was 121 percent of the 1957-59 base and 701 percent of the average for the base years 1910-14. Composite averages include only the reported cash portions of total farm wages, and omit the undetermined values of housing, food, or other items furnished. The U.S. average for persons hired per hour with board or room on July 1 was \$1.13 per hour, up 3 percent from a year earlier. Persons hired per month with house furnished averaged \$222 per month, also up 3 percent. Farm wage rates continued to reflect wide differences between States as shown in comparisons on pages 6 and 7. Southern States exhibit the same pattern of gradual increase reported in other regions, although at a lower level. Rates averaged highest in the Pacific region, followed in order by the Northeast and West North Central regions. The highest rates in the Nation were reported for the relatively smaller but much needed force

of farm workers in Alaska. Alaska rates averaged as follows: Per month with house, \$400; per month with board and room, \$300; per day and per hour without board or room, \$16.50 and \$2.00, respectively. Alaska hired workers numbered about 400 of the State total of 1,200 family and hired working in the June survey week.

June "Dairy Month" also Featured Hay Harvest

June this year again got top billing across the land as "Dairy Month" in advertising that told of the goodness of milk and its varied products. Dairy farming is an outstanding type of modern farming in which team work of agribusiness supplies a daily lift to everyone. Despite huge investments in equipment for better and easier work around farmsteads and barns, it still takes a lot of work to feed and milk the millions of cows in the Nation's herds twice a day. Getting the hay and other feeds ready is another big job. In the total of 106 million cattle on the Nation's farms at the first of this year, there were about 18 million milk cows. Farms are producing about 118,000,000 tons of hay this year, plus a huge tonnage of other forage that must be cured and stored to keep all these "hay burners" happy and producing milk and meat.

There is something exciting about making hay. Maybe it's the smell and vim of the hayfields or the big push of handling tons and tons with big machines or the gamble against rain during curing, but whatever the causes, haying stands out in June farm work "from Maine to California".

Hay and forage equipment now handles these millions of tons with less sweat than in days when field stacking and hand loading were more common, but it's still exciting to see and run these versatile choppers, crushers, balers, and pelleters. Wisconsin farmers, who lead all States in the number of dairy cows--2.4 million of them--also grow the most hay. In late June the job of putting up over 10 million tons was going strong. The first cutting had been taken from about half of the State's acreage, with good yields and quality generally reported.

Row Crop Cultivation and Small Grain Harvests Progress

By late June cultivation on most row crop acreage was far along. Cotton fields in most principal producing States were generally well cleaned of weeds on early plantings, but the contest with weeds continued in younger stands notably in the Texas high plains and in Oklahoma. Throughout the Corn Belt corn and soybean cultivation continued. Minnesota corn was mainly past first cultivation and growing fast. In Iowa 40 percent of the crop had reached that final "lay-by" cultivation with prospects for 80 percent completion in another week. Other States reported greater variation in growth and progress of cultivation in both corn and soybeans, but the work was well up with crop growth.

During the June survey week the harvest of small grains was moving northward at an increasing rate. Wheat harvest was about over in Texas, and

more than two-thirds complete in Kansas. In Missouri 30 percent of the winter wheat and about 10 percent of the oats were harvested. Wheat harvest had started in southwestern Nebraska and was about ready to move ahead in other areas ranging from New Jersey and Pennsylvania in the East to Southern Colorado and Central California in the West.

Reports show many variations in activities the country over with harvest of different crops starting in different areas. In New York State picking of sweet cherries was reaching a peak. The New Jersey blueberry harvest was increasing. There was considerable seeding of flax and other late crops in eastern and northeastern North Dakota. Tobacco harvest started in Georgia and South Carolina and early watermelon and cantaloup picking began. Broomcorn harvest was active in South Texas. Floods during early June in parts of western Montana caused human and property losses and added to work to be done the reclaiming of livestock, cleaning-up debris and restoring fences. Green pea harvest in the Columbia basin of Washington was over half completed. Harvest of strawberries in Oregon and Washington continued to increase, and the cherry harvest started. Flax harvest started in California's Imperial Valley.
