Wintry March Increases Livestock Care Field Work Delayed; Working Force Low

During the survey week of March 21-27 winter was the big boss on most of the Nation's farms, directing what could or must be done. Heavy blankets or drifts of snow in many northern sections and continued cold weather added to time required for feeding and other livestock chores. Wet soils throughout extensive southern and eastern areas also delayed the upsurge of field activity expected in late March. The result: A definite delay in farm work. The working force utilized in meeting the March work requirements totaled 4,677,000 workers, 12 percent less than in March of last year and a new record low for the period.

With field work impossible, farm operators were able to do almost all work on many farms, even those with livestock and dairy cows. The number of family workers in the March survey week at 3,706,000 persons was 12 percent less than in March 1964. However, even though the hours of assistance required from wives and children have been lessened by new equipment and livestock management methods, some stockmen in the Northern States during late March put in long and watchful hours helping save new-born calves, lambs, and pigs. They count on this care being repaid in a few weeks by seeing young livestock reveling in spring sunshine while tractors roar across the fields.

The number of hired workers in the March survey week totaled 971,000 or 10 percent less than in March 1964. With the prevailing seasonal field conditions, labor shortages were minimized even for specialty crops. In California, some rainy and cool weather in the principal asparagus area slowed growth and aided in the orderly harvest of fresh asparagus by a force of domestic farm workers considerably less numerous than required during the comparable period last year. Citrus harvest made good progress in California and Florida, and harvest of Florida sugarcane was completed.

April Farm Wage Rates 4 percent Above Last Year

Despite the slowness of the spring work season the upward push of farm wage rates shows clearly in reports from all areas. The level of farm wage rates reported by farm operators on April 1, 1965 was 26 percent above the 1957-59 average, and 4 percent over a year earlier. The average cash rate per hour, without board or room, increased 4 percent over April 1, 1964, to \$1.18 per hour. Monthly and daily rates also showed gains of 4 and 3 percent, respectively. Comparisons of April 1 State averages for 1964 and 1965 on pages 6

and 7 show the generally consistent trend in States and regions of wage increases for different hiring arrangements. Alaska reports topped averages for all other States with hourly rates without board or housing at \$2.05 per hour. The rates published represent crop and livestock reporters' farms and localities and thus reflect rates paid in many typical situations. Only cash payments are included.

Hours Worked During Survey Week Still at Winter Levels

The data on hours worked per week by different classes of farm workers during the week of March 21-27, shown on page 5, are based on the actual operations of about 23,000 farms representing many different kinds of farming throughout the Nation. The operators of these farms averaged 38.4 hours of farm work, a gain of over an hour, or about 4 percent over the February survey week. These averages include all farms reporting on hours worked even though the operator did little or no farm work in the survey week. Reports representing Alaska farm operators (not shown in table) averaged 43.3 hours per week, comparable with many other States.

Other family workers averaged 29.9 hours, up 2 percent from the previous month. The working hours for many hired workers were reduced by cool or rainy weather and averaged 34.3 hours per week, 2 percent less than in February.

The average of 35.5 hours per week for all workers was only a half hour longer than in the February survey week.

Other notable aspects of farm work in late March affecting future market supplies can be cited. Planting of Florida-Georgia shade tobacco was active. Much corn was being planted in Florida and Southern Alabama. In Texas, cotton planting moved ahead slowly in southern sections, sheep shearing was under way, and goat shearing neared completion in the main mohair producing center of the Edwards Plateau. Planting sugar beets continued in producing areas of Pacific States, and the Texas High Plains. California field plantings of a wide range of crops continued, and alfalfa harvest increased. Strawberry picking increased in Southern areas and started in the Santa Clara Valley near the central coast.
