Farm Workers Increase Seasonally Wage Rates Reach New High for July

The Nation's farm labor force totaled 6,244,000 for the week of June 19-25. Of this total, 4,216,000 were family members and 2,028,000 were hired workers. Even though this represents an increase of 9 percent in the total number of workers since the May survey week, it is 9 percent below the number for the corresponding period in 1965.

Compared with the May survey week, hired workers showed a 37 percent increase which was partially offset by a 1 percent decrease in numbers of family workers. Comparisons with June a year earlier, however, show the number of family workers and the number of hired workers declining 9 and 11 percent, respectively.

Farm work is increasing seasonally as more crops reach the harvesting stage. Wheat harvest ranged from near completion in the southwest to just starting in northern Kansas and southern Nebraska. Harvest crews are reported to be moving northward in sufficient numbers to meet harvest demands.

Most row crops are being cultivated. Progress of the corn crop is generally excellent. Soybean planting is in the final stages. Cotton plants are mostly in the "squaring" and "setting boll" stages of development. Tobacco harvest is active in Florida and becoming more active in southern parts of Georgia. Local labor supplies are being used for the harvesting and barning of this crop. Vegetable harvest is practically complete in extreme southern areas and becoming active in scattered areas throughout the Nation. Harvest is well underway in southern peach areas.

July Farm Wage Rates up 8 Percent from Last Year

The level of farm wage rates reported by farm operators on July 1, 1966, was 8 percent over a year earlier, and 35 percent above the 1957-59 average. The average cash rate per hour, without board or room, increased 8 percent over July 1, 1965, to \$1.26 per hour. Monthly and daily rates also showed similar gains. Comparisons of July 1 State averages for 1965 and 1966 on pages 7 and 8 show the generally consistent trend of wage rate increases for the various hiring arrangements. Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: per month with house, \$400; per month with board and room, \$290; per day without board or room, \$16.50; and per hour without board or room, \$2.25.

Hours Worked by Farm Workers

Farm workers, both family and hired, on reporting farms averaged 41.4 hours of farm work during the June survey week. This compares with 41.3 hours for the same period in 1965 and represents a decline of 0.4 hours from a month earlier. Family workers averaged a work week of 46.3 hours, an increase of 1.9 hours over the May 1966 survey week.

Considerably more hired workers were doing farm work than a month earlier; however, these workers averaged a shorter work week. They averaged 32.9 hours, a decline of 2.9 hours from the May 1966 survey week. The New England, Middle Atlantic, and East North Central regions showed declines of 4.8, 4.5, and 5.2 hours, respectively. The work week was 2.6 to 3.4 hours shorter in all other regions except the West South Central, which showed a decline of only 0.3 hour from a month earlier.
