Fewer Farm Workers

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of February 19-25 totaled 3,844,000, persons, 5 percent fewer than in the comparable period of 1966. This total includes 3,101,000 farm operators and unpaid family members working on home farms. The family work force also declined 5 percent from February 1966. Compared with the February 5-year averages, current totals show declines for family and all workers of 21 and 22 percent, respectively.

The hired work force totaled 743,000 persons, down 6 percent from the previous month. This total also represents a decline of nearly one-fourth from the 5-year average for February. About 43 percent of these paid workers were employed in California, Florida, Texas, and Arizona, where citrus and vegetable harvest was active. The seasonal increase from January 1967 is primarily the result of increased field activity across the South as spring draws near.

Farm workers on reporting farms averaged 34.8 hours of labor during the February survey week, practically unchanged from the previous month. Farm operators averaged a work week of 36.2 hours while other family members worked 29.0 hours. Hired workers averaged 35.3 hours during the week.

Extremely cold weather prevailed over the eastern half of the Nation, with freezing temperatures extending into southern Florida. The freeze did some damage to new growth and bloom of Florida citrus in the northern and western areas; however, little or no fruit loss is expected. Picking in Florida was slowed by rains during the week. Vegetable freeze damage was heavy in the north and central areas and south to the Ft. Myers - Immokalee area. Damage was variable depending on the stage of maturity and crop conditions. Many damaged fields will need to be replanted. Harvest was limited during the week and will be further delayed by the freeze.

California navel orange harvest was 60 percent complete in the central area and nearing 40 percent in the south. Lemon and avocado harvest was active, but grapefruit harvest was slow in the Coachella Valley. Vegetable harvest continued active in California and Arizona. Picking of Arizona citrus was slow in the Salt River Valley but continued active in the Yuma area where grapefruit, oranges, and tangerines were being harvested.

Texas early orange harvest was nearing completion as Valencia picking got underway with limited volume. Vegetable harvest was active in the lower Rio Grande Valley. Corn, cotton, and sorghum planting began in the lower Rio Grande Valley and Coastal Bend areas.

Annual Averages - Downward Trend Continues

Annual average farm employment for 1966 was 5,214,000--7 percent below 1965 and 18 percent below the 5-year average. This annual average consists of 3,854,000 family and 1,360,000 hired workers. The number of family workers was 17 percent below the 5-year average. The number of hired workers, declining at a faster pace, was down 21 percent.
