Farm Work Force Increases Seasonally

The Nation's farm labor force totaled 5,734,000 workers for the week of June 18-24. This was 7 percent above the total number during the May survey week, but 9 percent below the number of farm workers the same week in June 1966. Of this total, 3,973,000 were family members and 1,761,000 were hired workers.

Heavy Flooding Delays Wheat Harvest

Hot and humid weather continued across the South from Texas to the Atlantic during the survey period--making three to four weeks of such weather. Heavy rains caused flooding in the tributary basins of the lower Missouri River in southeastern Nebraska, eastern Kansas, and northern Missouri.

Kansas wheat harvest was delayed by rains; only about one-tenth of the crop had been harvested by the end of the survey week. Small grain harvest neared completion in the South and Southeast. Wheat was ripening in Nebraska, but fields were too wet for combining.

Moisture benefited the corn crop, but muddy fields curtailed cultivating in the Corn Belt. Planting of soybeans neared completion in the Southern States. Virtually all acreage has been planted in the North Central States. Emerged plants averaged 5 inches in height in several States.

Cotton plants are in the "squaring" and "flowering" stages. Tobacco harvest was active in Florida and getting underway in Georgia. Sugar beet thinning progressed in many areas; harvest continued in California and Arizona.

Peach harvest progressed rapidly in the Southeast. Strawberry picking was active in California, Michigan, most Northeastern States, and the far Northwest. Cherry harvest began in southwestern Michigan. Harvest of vegetable crops continued in the East Coast States. Also, harvest progressed well in Texas, Arizona, and California.

Length of Work Week Slightly Shorter

The length of the farm work week averaged 41.3 hours compared with 42.4 hours last month. Family workers averaged 44.8, down 1 percent from the previous month. Hired workers averaged 34.2 hours, 5 percent less than in May. Sharpest changes occurred in the North Central States, where heavy rains and flooding limited field work.

Farm Wage Rates Up 9 Percent

The level of farm wage rates as reported for farm workers on July 1, 1967, was 9 percent over a year earlier, and 48 percent above the 1957-59 average. The average cash rate per hour, without board or room, at \$1.36 per hour, increased 8 percent from July 1, 1966. Monthly and daily rates also showed similar gains. Comparisons of July 1 State averages for 1966 and 1967 on pages 7 and 8 show the generally consistent trend of wage rate increases for the various hiring arrangements. Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: per month with house, \$400; per month with board and room, \$300; per day without board or room, \$16.00; and per hour without board or room, \$2.30.

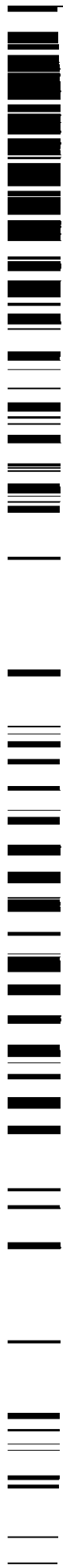
