Citrus Harvest Makes Good Progress

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of February 18-24 totaled 3,744,000 persons, 2 percent less than during the comparable period of 1967. There were 3,038,000 farm family members working during the survey week. Hired workers totaled 706,000 -- 5 percent below the corresponding period last year.

Farm workers averaged 34.2 hours during the February survey week compared to 33.7 hours a month earlier. Farm operators averaged 35.9 hours while other unpaid family members worked 28.5 hours. Hired workers averaged 35.1 hours during the survey week.

Heavy rains hit the northern Pacific coast during the survey week while heavy snows were blanketing areas in the Deep South. Exceptionally cold conditions prevailed in most Central and Eastern areas.

Navel orange harvest was advanced in Central California and nearly half completed in Southern California. Valencia orange harvest continues in Arizona with grapefruit harvest progressing slowly in the Salt River Valley. In Florida, harvest of oranges and grapefruit continued active. Peach growers throughout the Southeast were busy spraying and pruning trees.

Frozen fields allowed some much delayed corn harvest in Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. Chopping of cornstocks continues, along with spreading of fertilizer and lime. In Texas, planting of corn, sorghum, and cotton was delayed by cold, wet weather. Seeding of spring grains continued in California and portions of the Southwest. Early spring barley was being seeded in the Northwest.

Preparing and seeding tobacco beds was active in the Appalachian States. Some watering of seedbeds was being done in North Carolina, although watering was somewhat hampered by freezing weather. Land preparation and vegetable planting picked up in Alabama. Vegetable harvest was active in California. Planting of green peas was underway in Umatilla County of Oregon.

Annual Averages - Downward Trend Continues

Annual average farm employment for 1967 was 4,903,000 workers, 6 percent below 1966. This annual average consists of 3,650,000 family and 1,253,000 hired workers.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
