## Spring Activities Dominate Farm Labor Activity

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of March 24-30 is estimated at 4,186,000 persons, 4 percent less than during the comparable period of 1967. Of these 3,341,000 were farm family members. Hired workers totaled 845,000 -- 8 percent below the corresponding period last year.

Farm workers averaged 37.1 hours during the March survey week compared with 34.2 hours a month earlier. Farm operators averaged 40.4 hours while unpaid family members worked 29.8 hours. Hired workers averaged 35.6 hours during the survey week.

Mild weather over much of the Nation during the survey week increased fieldwork activity. Seeding of spring grains made rapid progress in the Plains and the Corn Belt. Seeding of spring wheat was about 15 percent completed in South Dakota. Oat seeding was approximately 25 percent completed in Iowa, 40 percent completed in Illinois, and slightly over half of the oats had been seeded in Missouri. In Kansas, 80 percent of the oats were seeded, while in Oklahoma, seeding was virtually completed. Small grains were being seeded in the eastern Corn Belt and North Atlantic States.

Planting of corn was active in the southern one-third of the Nation. Cotton planting was gaining momentum in central Arizona with activity picking up in Texas and other Southern States. Tobacco setting was active in Georgia. Sugar beet planting was underway in many areas of the country.

In Florida, vegetable harvest was active on the southern Peninsula. Lettuce harvest reached volume proportion in the Salt River Valley of Arizona, but was nearing the end in the Yuma area. Asparagus cutting was near completion in the Imperial Valley.

## Farm Wage Rates Continue Upward Trend

The level of farm wage rates reported by farm operators on April 1, 1968, was 7 percent higher than a year earlier. The average cash rate per hour without board or room increased to \$1.43 per hour, 7 percent over April 1, 1967. Monthly,

weekly, and daily rates showed similar gains. In index terms, seasonally adjusted, the national average reached 912 (1910-14=100), up from the 1967 average of 849.

Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: per month with house, \$400; per month with board and room, \$300; per day without board or room, \$16.00; and per hour without board or room, \$2.30.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
