Farm Labor Force Increases Seasonally

The Nation's farm work force is estimated at a total of 5,550,000 persons for the week of June 23-29. This represents a 9 percent seasonal increase from last month but is 3 percent below the comparable June survey week a year ago. Numbers of working family members and hired workers both gained from a month ago, but were 2 and 4 percent, respectively, below June 1967 levels.

The length of the work week averaged 40.3 hours compared with 40.1 hours last month. Family workers averaged 44.1 hours, up 4 percent from a month earlier. Hired workers averaged 33.3 hours, 6 percent less than in May. This reduction reflected the entry of school youths into the work force.

The Kansas wheat harvest moved into full swing late in the survey week as hot weather hastened ripening. Combining continued in some areas of the northern high plains of Texas. Harvest progressed northward into Nebraska under favorable weather conditions. Small grain harvest is nearing completion in the Southwest and in California. Fall grains are maturing rapidly in the Northwest. Prospects continue good for spring grains in the Northern States.

Corn prospects remain good in most areas of the Corn Belt despite generally below normal temperatures. Considerable corn acreage has been cultivated for the last time in Iowa, and about 60 percent has been laid-by in Kansas. Weediness is causing problems in northern growing areas.

Soybeans are making good growth in the central Corn Belt. Planting of soybeans continues in the South and Southeast where a second crop often follows small grain harvest. Cotton plants in the Southcentral region are squaring with some early fields blooming. Many fields are setting bolls in the Southwest and California. Tobacco harvest was 18 percent complete in Georgia and beginning in South Carolina.

The Southeastern peach harvest was in full swing. Harvest of Early Elbertas was beginning in California. Warm weather in California was hastening maturity of deciduous fruits. Vegetable harvest, nearing completion in Florida, was active in the North Atlantic States and California.

Farm Wage Rates Climb 7 Percent

The level of farm wage rates reported for hired workers on July 1, 1968, was 7 percent above a year earlier, and 59 percent above the 1957-59 average. The average cash rate per hour, without room and board, was \$1.45 per hour. This was 6 percent above July 1, 1967. Pay rates by the day, week, and month indicate similar gains. The consistent uptrend of wage rates for all hiring arrangements is illustrated on pages 7 and 8, which list the July 1 State averages for 1967 and 1968.

Alaska's Farm Wage Rates Up From Last Year

Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: per month with house, \$420; per month with board and room, \$320; per day without board or room, \$17.50; and per hour without board or room, \$2.30.

Farm employment represents the number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms 1 hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.

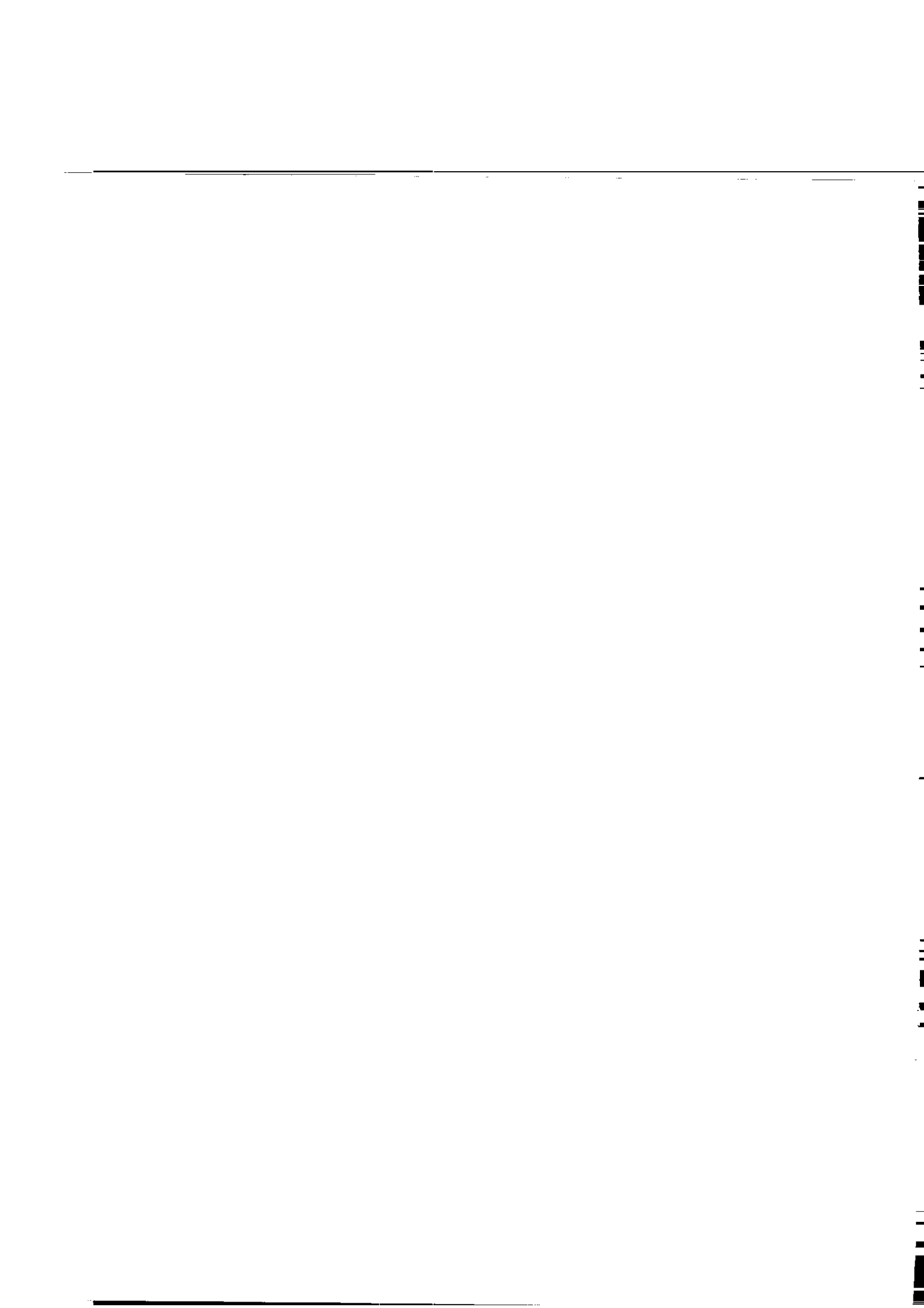
