Release
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Late Winter Weather Delays Field Work

The Nation's farm labor force for the survey week of March 23-29 dipped 5 percent from the March 1968 survey week. The Crop Reporting Board estimated 3,996,000 workers on farms during the March 1969 survey week with 3,181,000 farm operators and unpaid family members, and 815,000 hired persons.

Farm workers averaged 35.5 hours during the March survey week, up 2.2 hours from a month earlier. Farm operators worked an average of 37.7 hours, other unpaid family members 29.0 hours, and hired workers 35.2 hours during the week.

In the North Central States the final blast of winter held most spring farm work to a minimum. In most of the West, however, the first good weather of the year allowed spring farm activities to rise sharply.

In the Great Plains and Corn Belt States seeding of spring grains remained far behind normal. Only 27 percent of the Kansas oat crop had been sown. In Texas and some other Southern States, corn and sorghum planting had begun.

In California and Arizona, cotton planting was beginning and was 9 percent complete in Texas. Most tobacco plantbeds had been seeded in Kentucky, and some transplanting was underway in parts of Georgia. The North Carolina tobacco growers were fumigating and preparing fields. Sugar beet seeding was beginning in several Western States.

Spring vegetable planting had advanced as far north as the Carolinas. In Florida, vegetable harvest continued on most crops except melons. Lettuce harvest was increasing in the Salt River Valley of Arizona and was heavy in the Palo Verde Valley of California. Asparagus cutting near peak in California's Stockton Delta Area.

Florida's citrus harvest was slow. The California Navel orange harvest was declining but lemon picking remained heavy.

Farm Wage Rates Jump

Farm wage rates reported by farm operators on April 1, 1969, jumped 11 percent above a year earlier. The average cash rate per hour without board or room climbed to \$1.59 from \$1.44 on April 1, 1968. Comparable gains were recorded

in monthly, weekly, and daily rates. The seasonally adjusted national average index reached 1028 (1910-14=100) up from the 1968 average of 914.

Alaska's Farm Wage Rates

Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: per month with house, \$420; per month with board and room, \$320; per day without board or room, \$17.50; and per hour without board or room, \$2.30.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
