Inclement Weather Slows Farm Labor Force Seasonal Gain

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of June 22-28 gained only 5 percent from the May survey week. The estimated 5,256,000 total workers was 5 percent below the June 1968 survey week. There were 3,675,000 farm operators and unpaid family members. The 1,581,000 hired workers, though above the May survey week, represent an 8 percent decline from June last year.

Stormy weather conditions in much of the country held the average work week for all workers to 40.5 hours. Farm operators averaged 48.4 hours, other unpaid family members 34.7 hours, and hired workers 34.5 hours during the week.

Kansas Wheat Harvest Lags Behind Normal

The Kansas wheat harvest lagged behind a year ago and much behind normal. Many fields in the state were too wet to allow combining at the end of the survey period. Harvest was near completion in the Texas Plains and advancing rapidly in Oklahoma. Only a few fields had been entered in Nebraska. Wind, rain, and

hail were prevalent throughout the plains and Corn Belt States causing a delay in normal harvest.

The corn crop has made slow development in the northern and western areas of the Corn Belt. Weed control has become a problem in the areas of heaviest rainfall. The crop was developing rapidly in the Southeastern States, where hot dry weather prevailed.

Some late plantings of soybeans were delayed by rain. Earlier plantings were in good condition in most areas. Cotton developed rapidly in the Southeast while the first picking began in Texas. Cotton was squaring and blooming in California and Arizona. Tobacco harvest was 26 percent complete in Georgia and about ready to start in North Carolina.

Peach harvest was 40 percent complete in Georgia and in full swing in South Carolina. Picking of the California Clingstone peach crop will be underway in early July along with the Bartlett Pear crop. Vegetable harvest was shifting to the late spring and summer growing areas in the Northern part of the country but continued steady in California.

Farm Wage Rate Rise Again

Farm wage rates reported by farm operators on July 1, 1969 rose 10 percent above a year earlier. The average cash rate per hour without board or room climbed to \$1.58 from \$1.45 a year earlier. Similar type gains were recorded in pay rates by day, week, and month.

Alaska's Farm Wage Rates Hold Steady

Wage rates reported for farm workers in Alaska were as follows: month with house, \$420; per month with board and room, \$320; per day without board or room \$17.50; and per hour without board or room, \$2.30.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
