## December Work Force Declined Seasonally

The Nation's farm labor force totaled 3,399,000 workers during the week of December 20-26, 1970. This is 17 percent fewer than in the comparable week in November and 3 percent below December 1969. There were 2,762,000 working farm operators and unpaid family workers and 637,000 hired laborers in December. The 1970 annual average of 4,486,000 farm workers is down 2 percent from 1969, reflecting further mechanization of farming operations.

Farmworkers averaged 32.4 hours during the December survey week which included Christmas. This compares with a 36.3 hour work week in November and 32.7 hours in December 1969. Farm operators averaged 33.1 hours per week, unpaid family members 28.9 hours and hired workers 33.8 hours.

### Farm Wage Rates Increase

The January 1, 1971, composite hourly rate for farmworkers at \$1.58 was up 5 percent from a year earlier while the hourly cash rate at \$1.76 was also up 5 percent. Pay rates by the day, week and month were up similarly. The 1970 annual composite hourly rate average of \$1.42 was an increase of 7 percent over 1969. Annual wage rates for 1969 and 1970 for various hiring arrangements are shown on pages 9 and 10.

### Cold Weather Restricts Farm Activity

The dry conditions that have prevailed for the past 7 weeks continued in western Texas and Oklahoma. Small grains also need additional moisture in western Kansas. Stands and condition of the Kansas crop are good to excellent. In the Northern Plains the wheat crop is dormant and covered with snow. Winter wheat in the Pacific Northwest received some additional moisture but it was accompanied by undesirable cold temperatures.

Fall-seeded grains in the North Central States remain in good condition with adequate moisture. Conditions improved in the Carolinas where earlier dry weather had held back growth.

Routine care of livestock was the major activity over the holidays. However, snow and the coldest temperatures of the season across the northern half of the Nation caused extra work for many livestock farmers who had to increase supplemental feeding.

Farm employment represents the number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms 1 hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.

QUARTERLY PROBABILITY FARM LABOR SURVEY

The April, June, and November 1970 issues of Farm Labor included selected farm wage rate data derived from probability farm labor surveys conducted in January, April, and July of that year. Data presented below result from a similar survey conducted in October 1970. These data do not replace the farm wage rate series regularly published in Farm Labor, but supplement them.

The size of the sample for the October survey was about 3,000 employers, the same as for the July survey. Because of the small sample, the data published are limited to averages for California and the United States.
