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FARM LABOR FORCE SMALLER

The Nation's farm labor force for the survey week of February 20-26, 1972 was estimated at 3,509,000 workers or 16,000 fewer than a year earlier. This includes 2,759,000 farm operators and unpaid family workers and 751,000 hired workers. The hired labor force was up almost 4 percent from a year earlier.

Farm workers labored an average of 34.5 hours during the February survey week, compared with 33.1 hours in the January week. Farm operators averaged 35.4 hours, unpaid family members 29.5, and hired workers 36.0 hours during the week.

Orange and grapefruit harvest was active in California, Arizona, and Texas; however, activity in Florida was largely that of salvaging fruit knocked down earlier by high winds.

Lettuce harvest was at a peak in California's Imperial Valley. Carrot shipments are increasing in the Oxnard and Orange districts of California. Vegetable harvest was active in Texas' lower Rio Grande Valley. Cabbage planting was under way in the Carolinas.

Spring activities have started. Planting was active in the dry Southwest. Cotton, sorghum, and corn planting has started in the lower Rio Grande Valley and the Coastal Bend of Texas. Sugarbeet and safflower planting was under way in California. The maple sirup season started in Ohio with warm temperatures starting the sap flowing.

Farm employment represents the number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms 1 hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.

QUARTERLY PROBABILITY FARM LABOR SURVEY

The selected wage rate items presented below were derived from a probability farm labor survey conducted in January 1972 by the Statistical Reporting Service. This continues the series of published farm wage rates from Quarterly probability surveys started in April 1970. These data do not replace the farm wage rate series regularly published in *Farm Labor*, but supplement them.

The inputs for making the following wage rate computations were supplied by employers of farm labor in the mainland 48 States. The sample was not large enough to provide wage rates for all States, but was of sufficient size to provide indicators for California and the United States.
