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SMALL GRAIN HARVEST NEARLY COMPLETE

The Nation's farm labor force for the survey week of September 17-23 was estimated at 5,102,500 workers or about 6,000 fewer than a year ago. The farm work force consisted of 3,660,000 farm operators and unpaid family members and 1,442,500 hired workers.

Farmworkers averaged 38.3 hours during the September survey week, compared with 37.4 hours in August. Farm operators worked an average of 43.5 hours; other unpaid family members, 32.0; and hired hands worked 34.3 during the September week.

Farm operators reported wage rates on October 1, 1972 were up about 7 percent from a year earlier. The average cash rate without board and room rose to \$1.82 per hour from \$1.70 on October 1, 1971. Monthly, weekly, and daily rates were up similarly. The seasonally adjusted farm wage rate index reached 147 on the 1967 base, an increase of 7 percent from a year earlier.

Planting of the 1973 winter wheat crop advanced rapidly during the survey week of September 17-23 in the southern Great Plains States. North Dakota farmers continued to wind up their small grain harvest, but were slowed by poor drying conditions. Silo filling with corn silage was in full swing in the northern half of the Nation. Corn harvesting in the Southern States was gaining momentum and early harvesting of mature fields was starting in the Corn Belt.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.

Combining of soybeans had also started in the Corn Belt. However, maturity of the crop continued to lag behind normal. Some light harvest had begun in the Southern States.

Cotton harvesting had started in most producing areas and should soon become more active. The burley tobacco harvest was active in western North Carolina and winding up in Kentucky and Tennessee.

Potato digging was rapidly increasing in Idaho and active in Aroostook County, Maine. The sugarbeet harvest was increasing in California and just starting in Washington.

Apple picking was active and widespread in Northern orchards. Cranberry harvest was underway in Massachusetts and New Jersey. Grape harvesting continued in California and was just starting in the Finger Lakes area of New York.

Vegetable harvesting continued with wet fields plaguing farmers in Michigan and Wisconsin. New York needs an extended season to complete harvest of sweet corn, snap beans, cabbage, and tomatoes. Harvest of late summer vegetables was seasonally active in California. Planting of fall vegetables was active in Florida.
