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Work Force Larger Than Year Ago

The Nation's farm labor force for the survey week of September 23-29 numbered 5,068,500 workers, slightly larger than a year ago. The work force consisted of 3,635,600 farm operators and unpaid family members and 1,432,900 hired workers.

Farm workers averaged 38.5 hours during the September survey week, compared with 38.7 hours in August and 38.3 hours in September 1972. Farm operators worked an average of 43.5 hours; other unpaid family members 32.3; and hired workers 35.0 hours during the survey week.

Wages Continue To Climb

Farm wage rates on October 1, 1973 were up about 9 percent from a year earlier. The average cash rate without board and room was \$1.97 per hour, up 15 cents from October 1, 1972. Wages paid by the month, week, or day were also higher. The seasonally adjusted index of Farm Wage Rates was 161 on October 1, 1973, about 10 percent higher than a year ago.

Wet Weather Hampers Harvest

Wet weather hampered harvest activities during the week of September 23-29 in many areas. Soybean combining gained momentum in the Eastern Corn Belt, but rains hampered harvest in the Western Corn Belt. In the South, soybean harvest was just getting started.

Mild temperatures and wet weather prevailed over the Corn Belt as the corn crop matured rapidly. Picking was underway in Corn Belt States, although very limited in Wisconsin and Nebraska.

Cotton is opening rapidly in the South. Moderate to heavy rains stopped cotton harvesting in Texas at mid-week and held up harvesting in Arkansas. Defoliation was active in most cotton producing areas.

Potato digging in Idaho resumed at mid-week after being delayed by rain. The potato harvest in Aroostook County, Maine was active during the week. Rice harvesting continued behind schedule in Texas and was delayed by rain in Louisiana and Arkansas.

Harvesting weather was favorable in the Northeast fruit orchards. The New York apple harvest made good progress and the Concord grape harvest got underway in the Finger Lakes area. Apple picking was in full swing in the Pacific States. The California grape harvest remained active. Picking of Valencia oranges, grapefruit, and lemons continued in California.

The vegetable harvest moved along normally in the Pacific States. Fall lettuce harvesting increased in New Jersey, the Texas High Plains, and Arizona. Frequent rains and wet fields delayed seeding and land preparation in the Texas lower Rio Grande Valley.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
