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Farm Labor Force Below Last Year

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of March 24-30, 1974 totaled 3,770,700 workers, about 1 percent below the comparable period a year ago. The total includes 2,896,200 operators and unpaid family workers and 874,500 hired workers.

The average workweek for farmworkers during the March survey period was 36.3 hours, compared with 34.6 hours during the February week. Farm operators averaged 38.7 hours, unpaid family members 30.6, and hired workers 35.0 hours during the week.

Wages Continue to Climb

Farm wage rates rose to \$2.21 per hour (without board or room) on April 1, 1974, an increase of 24 cents from a year ago. Wages paid by the month, week, and day were also higher. The seasonally adjusted index of Farm Wage Rates was 173 on the 1967 base for April 1, 1974, about 10 percent higher than a year ago.

Wet Weather Restricts Fieldwork

Wet weather restricted fieldwork in much of the eastern half of the Nation during the week of March 24-30. Warm, sunny days over the central and southern Plains States provided excellent outdoor working conditions. Field preparations and early planting are well along in most southern areas except for parts of Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia where wetness has caused delays.

Florida citrus harvest declined slightly as harvest of early and midseason oranges were in the cleanup stages. Navel orange harvest continued in California while light Valencia picking was started. In Texas, citrus harvest for fresh market declined as the bulk of the crop is going to processing.

Vegetable workers increased in Florida as harvest of cabbage, tomatoes, and peppers increased. In California, lettuce moved in good volume at Palo Verde, celery supplies increased in the south, and carrot digging continued in the central coast and Parris-Hemet areas. Tomato and cabbage transplanting is in full swing in the Carolinas.
