## JUNE FARM WORKERS LESS THAN A YEAR AGO

The farm labor force in the United States for the week of June 23-29 totaled 5.1 million workers, off 2 percent from a year ago. The June 1974 work force was made up of 3.5 million operators and unpaid family members and 1.6 million hired workers. Each was 2 percent below a year ago.

Farm workers averaged 41.7 hours worked during the survey week almost the same as the 41.5 hours last year. The average in May 1974 was 40.2 hours. Farm operators worked 49.1 hours, other unpaid family members 36.7, and hired workers put in 35.5 hours during the week of June 23-29.

## WAGE RATES HIGHER

Farm wage rates advanced to \$2.25 per hour (without room and board) on July 1, 1974, up 24 cents from a year ago and 4 cents from last quarter. Wages paid by the month, week, and day were all higher than last July. The seasonally adjusted index based on 1967 stood at 173, compared with 156 a year ago but the same as last quarter.

## HARVEST ACTIVITIES INCREASE

Winter wheat harvest made excellent gains during the week of June 23-29, much ahead of 1973 and normal harvest in most States. Harvesting moved northward into Nebraska, Indiana, and Ohio during the week. Wheat harvest in Texas was almost completed and about half complete along the Kansas-Nebraska border. Oat harvest was getting underway in Kansas and was nearing completion in Texas, Arkansas, South Carolina, and Georgia.

Harvest of early vegetables was underway in New York and New Jersey and was nearing completion in the coastal counties of South Carolina. Watermelon harvest was increasing in South Carolina, Arkansas and Texas and continued in good volume in Georgia. Cantaloupe harvest was declining in the Desert, but was increasing in the San Joaquin Valley of California. The Lower Rio Grande Valley of Texas was in final stages of cantaloupe and honeydew harvesting but cantaloupes were being harvested in Laredo and San Antonio. Heavy rains hampered the watermelon and sweet corn harvest in Florida.

Peach harvest gained momentum in South Carolina and continued in Georgia. Sweet cherry harvest was underway in southern Pennsylvania and about to begin in western New York. California grapefruit harvest neared completion in the Desert, while lemon picking was active.

Wisconsin and Minnesota farmers took advantage of a sunny week and made good progress on their first hay cutting. But wet conditions in the eastern Corn Belt and North Atlantic Region hampered haying on many farms. Harvest of flue-cured tobacco gained momentum in South Carolina and just got underway in North Carolina.

Planting of soybeans in the Corn Belt neared completion during the survey week and made good progress in the South. Many farmers were busy planting soybeans in fields following wheat harvest. Cool temperatures continue to slow maturity in all major soybean States.

The Nation's corn crop continued to grow well under much cooler than normal temperatures during the week of June 23-29. The Corn Belt crop was in fair to good condition with mostly adequate soil moisture.

The cool temperatures slowed development of the cotton crop in much of the major producing areas. Weed and insect control has been effective as the application of herbicides, insecticides, and cultivation remained active.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
