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Work Force Smaller Than Year Ago

The Nation's farm labor force for the week of September 22-28 totaled 4.8 million workers, slightly smaller than last year. The work force consisted of 3.4 million farm operators and unpaid family members and 1.4 million hired workers.

All farm workers averaged 38.3 hours during the September survey week, the same as last month and compares to 38.5 hours last year. Farm operators worked an average of 43.3 hours while other unpaid family workers averaged 32.5 hours and hired workers averaged 34.2 hours.

Wages Continue To Increase

The average cash rate per hour without board and room on October 1, 1974 was \$2.22, up 24 cents from last year and 40 cents greater than two years ago. Wages paid by the month, week, or day were also higher. The seasonally adjusted index of Farm Wage Rates based on 1967 was 180 on October 1, 1974, about 12 percent larger than a year earlier.

Corn And Soybean Harvest Underway

Corn harvest started in most North Central States during the week of September 22-28. The rate of harvest was behind average in Illinois, Ohio and some southern States but slightly ahead of normal in Nebraska and about average in Indiana.

Soybean harvest got underway in most North Central States but progress was much behind normal in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. Combining was in the early stages in the South.

Dry weather in the Northern Plains enabled farmers to make good harvesting progress of small grains and combining is nearly complete. Rains slowed winter wheat seeding in much of Texas and Oklahoma, but progress advanced rapidly elsewhere in the Great Plains.

Cotton picking had started in Oklahoma, Arkansas and North Carolina; gaining momentum as weather permitted in Louisiana, Mississippi and South Carolina. Harvest made little progress in Texas as cool, wet weather prevailed.

Potato digging continued active in most of the fall producing States. Sugar beet lifting had started in Michigan, Minnesota and North Dakota. Cool, wet weather stalled sorghum harvest in Texas while harvest was active in Kansas and Nebraska. Tobacco harvest was nearing completion in the major areas and peanut digging was well along in Georgia.

Apple harvest continued active in western New York, Michigan and Wisconsin. Harvest of Red and Golden Delicious apples was gaining in Washington. Wine grape harvest was underway in California while raisin-drying conditions remained favorable but boxing had been slow.

Frost ended most vegetable growth in many of the North Central and North Atlantic States. Fall vegetable harvest was picking up in Florida and California. Vegetable planting was curtailed in most areas of Texas as moderate to heavy rains fell.

Farm employment represents number of family and hired labor working during the survey week. Family labor includes farm operators working on farms one hour or more plus other family members working 15 hours or more without receiving cash wages during survey week. Hired workers include all persons working one hour or more for cash wages during the survey week. These data should not be confused with the data published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS). The BLS data are derived from a household survey where each member 16 years of age and older is classified as performing farm or nonfarm work on the basis of major activity during the survey week.
