FARM WORK FORCE SLIGHTLY LESS THAN A YEAR AGO

The Nation's farm work force for the week of January 12-18 totaled 3,367,300 workers, down one percent from a year ago. Farm operators and unpaid family workers totaled 2,534,500 while hired workers numbered 832,800.

Farm operators and unpaid family members averaged 29.6 hours of work during the January survey week, the same as last year. Farm operators averaged 28.8 hours and unpaid family members 32.7 hours. Hired workers averaged 36.3 hours in January 1975 compared with 37.3 in January 1974.

WAGE RATES CONTINUE UP

Farm wage rates for the week of January 12-18 averaged \$2.49 per hour for all methods of pay. This is up 22 cents from a year ago. Wages paid on an hourly basis for those receiving cash only, averaged \$2.53 compared with \$2.22 a year ago.

SPECIAL NOTICE

This is the first issue of the Farm Labor Report showing estimates of farm employment by quarters based on the Quarterly Agricultural Labor Survey. Data for all of 1974 and for January 1975 are included. Future estimates will be issued each quarter. This issue also includes revised monthly estimates for 1974. The monthly estimates were discontinued with December 1974. Included are adjustment factors for use in interpolating monthly data from the quarterly estimates.

WET CONDITIONS STALLED HARVEST OF REMAINING FIELD CROPS

Rain and wet field conditions stalled harvest in areas with remaining field crops during the survey week of January 12-18, 1975. Strong winds and blizzard conditions covered much of the Western North Central States, causing difficulties in feeding and caring for livestock.

Wet field conditions slowed cotton picking in States where the crop is still in the field. Corn harvest continued to be delayed by soft fields and wet weather in parts of the corn belt States. Soybean harvest was also hampered by wet conditions. Tobacco stripping continued in Maryland, and Kentucky farmers were busy finishing up. Tobacco bed preparation continued in Georgia and South Carolina. Sugarcane harvest in Florida continued at a steady pace. Light harvest of winter potatoes was underway in Florida.

Harvest of citrus was seasonally active in California, Texas, and Florida. Fruit tree pruning was active in States on both coasts. Shipment of most winter vegetables were at seasonal levels.

MONTHLY ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Adjustment factors that can be used to calculate monthly data from quarterly estimates are provided on pages 20 and 21 of this publication. Official estimates of farm employment are no longer available on a monthly basis. For those who have need for monthly farm labor information, these factors may be used to interpolate such data.

In using these factors, two basic assumptions must be made. First, it must be assumed that the week for which the official estimate is available is representative; second, that changes in farm employment from month to month bear a uniform relationship with the average change for a recent 5-year period.

The adjustment factors are derived from official estimates of monthly farm labor employment numbers. They are based on the 5-year 1969-73 average. Monthly estimates covered the last full week of the month ending at least one day before the end of the month. The 5-year average number of farm workers in one month divided by the average for the previous month gives the adjustment factor or percent. As shown in the table, for example, the average number of family workers in Oklahoma in February is 109 percent of those family workers in January. Georgia hired workers in May average 106 percent of April, while in Nebraska hired workers in November are 80 percent of October. A different factor is used for family and hired workers. To interpolate farm employment for hired workers in Alabama in February, for example, the official estimate of 19,000 hired workers during the week of January 12-18 times 106 percent would give 20,000 workers.

Quarterly estimates of farm employment beginning in January 1975 cover the weeks which include the 12th of January, April, July and October. This work week coincides with that used for non-farm employment.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY FOR QUARTERLY AGRICULTURAL LABOR ESTIMATES

Quarterly estimates of agricultural labor are derived from multiple frame surveys. These are probability surveys based on modern statistical theory. Two sampling frames are utilized--a list frame and an area frame. In combination, they complement each other.

The list frame is assembled from various sources and consists of employers of agricultural labor (excluding agricultural service firms). It includes an index that relates to the number of workers hired by each employer. A random sample is selected from this list for each of the quarterly surveys. To increase sampling efficiency, employers expected to have large numbers of workers are sampled more heavily than those with fewer workers. This list does not represent all agricultural workers because it does not contain all current employers of agricultural labor. Additional procedures are needed to provide unbiased estimates of the list incompleteness.

The area sampling frame is essentially a complete listing of small partitioned units of land which can be sampled. For example, the total land area of a State can be broken into small parcels which can be listed and then sampled. Since all agriculture must be associated with a least one of these sampling units, a probability sample from the area frame will provide unbiased estimates for all agricultural workers employed by farm operators. However, it is a less efficient sampling frame than the list frame because most of the labor is hired by a small proportion of the farm operators. Therefore, the area frame is used primarily to estimate for the workers who are not represented by the list. In this way, the attributes of both the list and the area frames are used to best advantage.

All principles of probability sampling apply to multiple frame sampling. With reference to the agricultural labor surveys, all workers have some known positive probability of being included in the sample, except those employed by agricultural service firms; such as fertilizer applicators, picking crews particularly for specialty crops, herbicide and pesticide applicators and other types of work performed under contract. Therefore, all types of workers employed by farm operators are represented. Theoretically, two criteria must be satisfied in multiple frame sampling. First, all workers must be associated with at least one of the sampling frames. Second, it is necessary to establish to which frame or frames each sample unit belongs. The first criterion is satisfied by the complete area frame, which includes all workers. The second criterion requires that all workers identified in the area frame sample must be properly classified as to whether or not they are also represented in the list frame.

The survey methodology used with the new agricultural labor estimating program is now used extensively by SRS in a variety of estimating programs. It has proved to be a most efficient method of compiling reliable agricultural statistics.
