APRIL MILK PRICES SHOW SOME DECLINES

April milk price changes are principally decreases according to reports reaching the U.S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics. The principal change in the eastern section is a 46 cents per cwt. reduction of Class I prices in Connecticut, where retail prices are also 1 cent per quart lower. Connecticut markets are operating under regulations of the State Milk Control Board, and an action of that Board eliminated all minimum resale price regulations after April 1. Other cities showing price decreases are Knoxville, Tenn., Lexington, Ky., Dallas, Texas, Colorado Springs, Colo., and several California markets. At Knoxville, the reductions affect both dealers' buying and selling prices, the former dropping 43 cents

per cwt., and the latter 2 cents per quart. The Lexington Class I price is 26 cents per cwt. lower, but the retail price change is 1 to 2 cents per quart. The Dallas and Colorado Springs changes are limited to buying prices only and amount to 25 and 27 cents per cwt. respectively. The California markets are those in the San Francisco and Los Angeles sales areas, all under Federal license, and the changes on Class I milk, which approximate 24 cents per cwt. apparently apply to but part of the supply. Retail prices in the Los Angeles area only are 1 cent per quart lower, remaining unchanged at San Francisco. A similar retail price reduction is reported at Fresno, Calif. Milwaukee reports show a Class I reduction of

The advances shown for Springfield and Worcester, Mass. of 46 cents and 36 cents per cwt. on Class I and 1 cent per quart retail actually became effective in March.
