OCTOBER FLUID MILK MARKETS GENERALLY STEADY

Reports from fluid milk markets reveal very few changes in October from the previous month, and those which occurred do not change general averages. There have been comments in the press regarding the milk strike at Chicago but as yet the Class I increase from \$1.75 per cwt. to \$2.50 demanded by certain groups has not been agreed upon. Retail prices at St. Louis are 2 cents per quart lower than those published last month, this change having become effective September 14. The Class I price under the Federal license remains at \$2.25 per cwt. At San Francisco the price for Class I milk set by the local Milk Board in accordance with the new State law, and effective October 7, is now 62 cents per pound of butterfat, (\$2.17 per cwt. for 3.5 percent

milk) instead of 55 cents. Class I prices are slightly lower than in September at Indianapolis and at Pueblo, Colorado, but at Winona, Minn., declines of 83 cents per cwt. on Class I and 2 cents per quart on retail milk are in effect. Increases are reported from two Southern cities, 40 cents per cwt. at Greensboro, N.C., and 10 to 35 cents per cwt. at Birmingham, Ala. At another Southern city, Miami, Florida, however, some of the local supply is reported as being bought this month at 70 cents less per cwt. than in September. Dairy markets generally are in a fairly firm position. Stocks of dairy products are heavy, but changes in production trends since the flush season, and some buying by the Government for relief distribution, have lent support.
