

FLUID MILK AND CREAM REPORT

SEPTEMBER 1970

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MILK PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

Class I prices: The early September price paid by dealers for milk used for fluid purposes (Class I) averaged \$6.92 per hundredweight for about 150 markets, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This is 2 cents above August and 15 cents above a year earlier. Regional averages were all above a year earlier and ranged from 6 cents in the Pacific Region to 30 cents in the East South Central Region.

Store milk prices: Store prices to consumers in 25 major cities in early September averaged 57.5 cents per half gallon for the most common grade of whole milk. This price was 0.3 cent higher than August and over 2.5 cents above a year earlier.

Home-delivered prices: Prices for home-delivered milk averaged 64.8 cents per half gallon in September for 25 major cities.

This price was 0.2 cent below August but 2 cents above September 1969. The home-delivered prices represent list prices before deductions for quantity and other discounts.

SALES OF FLUID DAIRY PRODUCTS AND RECEIPTS
OF MILK FROM PRODUCERS

Preliminary July sales: Preliminary data on total sales of fluid dairy products during July 1970 in 66 marketing areas averaged over 1 percent above a year earlier.

June sales: Revised total sales of fluid products for June in regulated markets (61 Federal and 5 State) averaged nearly 3 percent above a year earlier. Cumulative sales for the first half of 1970 were nearly equal to a year earlier.

Whole milk sales during June were up nearly 1 percent from June 1969. Cumulative sales for the first half of the year were down over 2 percent from a year earlier.

Low-fat and skim milk sales in June were up nearly 11 percent from a year earlier and the cumulative sales were up over 9 percent for the first half of the year.

Milk and cream mixtures sales (mostly half and half) averaged nearly 4 percent below June 1969. For the first half of 1970, cream mixture sales were down 7 percent from the same period a year earlier. Cream sales (sweet and sour) for June were up nearly 3 percent from a year earlier. Total cream sales for the first 6 months of 1970 were 3 percent below a year earlier.

Milk receipts: July receipts of milk from producers at plants regulated for 68 markets were up over 4 percent from a year earlier. The number of producers delivering milk to plants for the same markets was down 2 percent from July 1969.

Milk production: United States milk production in August was estimated at 9.73 billion pounds, 0.6 percent more than a year earlier. August output provided 1.53 pounds of milk per person daily for all uses, the same as a year earlier, but less than the 1.60 pounds for July. Production during the first 8 months of 1970 was 0.3 percent more than a year earlier.
