HIGHLIGHTS

CORN stored in all positions on March 1, 1989 is estimated at 5.20 billion bushels. Of the total stocks, 3.02 billion bushels were stored on-farms. Off-farm stocks totaled 2.18 billion bushels. The December 1988-February 1989 indicated disappearance based on supply and March 1 stocks was 1.87 billion bushels, 13 percent below the disappearance of 2.14 during December 1987-February 1988.

WHEAT in all storage positions March 1, 1989 is estimated at 1.22 billion bushels, down 37 percent from March 1, 1988. Farm stocks, at 457 million bushels, are off 39 percent from last March 1. Off-farm stocks total 763 million bushels, 35 percent less than a year ago. The indicated disappearance from all positions for the quarter ending March 1, 1989 is 490 million bushels, down 15 percent from the comparable period last year.

DURUM WHEAT stocks on March 1 are 78.2 million bushels, off 25 percent from last year. Farm stocks are down 32 percent to 43.6 million bushels. Durum in off-farm storage is 34.6 million bushels, 15 percent less than last March 1. The indicated quarterly disappearance from all positions is 12.3 million bushels, down 22 percent from the same period last year.

SOYBEANS stored in all positions on March 1, 1989 totaled 890 million bushels, down 22 percent from the 1.15 billion bushels in storage on March 1, 1988. Farm stocks, at 415 million bushels, were down 25 percent from the March 1, 1988 total of 552 million bushels. Off-farm stocks were estimated at 475 million bushels, down 20 percent from the 595 million bushels on March 1, 1988.

Indicated disappearance from all storage positions during the December 1988-February 1989 period totaled 477 million bushels, down 22 percent from December 1987-February 1988. Indicated disappearance to date for the 1988 marketing year, at 951 million bushels, is 22 percent below the comparable 1987 marketing year disappearance of 1.21 billion bushels.

BARLEY stored in all positions on March 1, 1989 totaled 280 million bushels.


Of the total barley stocks on-hand, 123 million bushels were stored on-farms and 157 million bushels were stored off-farms.
