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HIGHLIGHTS

CORN stored in all positions on March 1, 1990 is estimated at 4.81 billion bushels, down 8 percent from March 1, 1989. Of the total stocks, 2.91 billion bushels were stored on-farms and off-farm stocks totaled 1.90 billion bushels. The December 1989-February 1990 indicated disappearance, based on supply and March 1 stocks, was 2.27 billion bushels, 21 percent above the disappearance of 1.87 billion bushels during December 1988-February 1989.

ALL WHEAT stored in all positions on March 1, 1990 totaled 944 million bushels, down 23 percent from March 1, 1989. Farm stocks are 381 million bushels, down 18 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks are placed at 563 million bushels, down 26 percent from March 1, 1989. The indicated disappearance from all positions for the quarter ending March 1, 1990 is 479 million bushels, off 2 percent from the disappearance for the same quarter last year.

DURUM WHEAT in all storage positions on March 1, 1990 totaled 78.6 million bushels, up less than 1 percent from last March 1. Farm stocks are 46.9 million bushels, up 7 percent, while the off-farm total is 31.7 million bushels, down 9 percent from 1989. The quarterly disappearance from all positions is 21.6 million bushels, up 79 percent from the comparable period a year ago.

SOYBEANS stored in all positions on March 1, 1990 totaled 1.06 billion bushels, 19 percent above March 1, 1989 holdings. On-farm stocks totaled 536 million bushels, up 29 percent from the previous March 1. Off-farm holdings, at 520 million bushels, were 9 percent above March 1, 1989.

Indicated disappearance from all positions during the December 1989 - February 1990 quarter totalled 554 million bushels, 16 percent above the comparable quarter a year earlier. Disappearance to date for the 1989-90 marketing year reached 1.05 billion bushels, up 10 percent from the same period during 1988-89.

BARLEY stored in all positions on March 1, 1990 is estimated at 253 million bushels, 10 percent below the March 1, 1989 stocks. Of the total barley stocks on hand, 103 million bushels were stored on farms, 17 percent below a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 150 million bushels, were down 5 percent from last year.

OAT stocks in all positions on March 1, 1990 totaled 215 million bushels. On-farm stocks are 140 million bushels, with off-farm stocks of 74.7 million bushels. Oat and grain sorghum stocks have not been estimated on March 1 since 1985.

GRAIN SORGHUM stored in all positions March 1, 1990 is estimated at 514 million bushels. Off-farm stocks account for 426 million bushels. The September 1989 - February 1990 indicated disappearance is 544 million bushels.

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WHEAT SPROUT DAMAGE REPORT

The National Agricultural Statistics Service conducted a special survey of 1,125 wheat producers in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington to determine the extent of sprout damage in wheat stocks held on farms March 1. The survey was conducted at the request of producer organizations in these four States. For the four States combined, 6.9 percent of the wheat stocks held on farms March 1 was reported by producers to have sprout damage. The reported percentages of March 1 wheat stocks on farms with sprout damage by State were as follows: Idaho, 1 percent; Montana, 8 percent; Oregon, 2 percent; and Washington, 10 percent. Since the percentage of sprout damaged wheat is a small portion of all wheat stored, relative sampling variations can be quite large. Therefore, data users are cautioned to use these percentages as only a general indication of the quantity of sprout damaged wheat on farms March 1.

The National Agricultural Statistics Service has made the following changes in the **GRAIN STOCKS** estimating program, effective March 30, 1990.

- o Estimates of **OATS** and **GRAIN SORGHUM** stocks will be restored to the quarterly program, for both on-farm and off-farm holdings.
- o On-farm stocks will be published for North Dakota **SOYBEANS** and Arkansas and North Carolina **WHEAT**.
- o On-farm stocks will be included in the unallocated total for **SOYBEANS** in Alabama; for **WHEAT** in Georgia; for **GRAIN SORGHUM** in Alabama, Kentucky, and Tennessee; and for **BARLEY** in Arizona.
- o The on-farm stocks program will be discontinued for **GRAIN SORGHUM** in Arizona and California; for **OATS** in Kentucky, New Jersey, and Virginia; and for **BARLEY** in New Mexico.
