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INVENTORY DOWN 7 PERCENT

Inventory of all hogs and pigs in the U.S. on June 1, 1986 is estimated at 48.8 million head, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. This is 7 percent below a year ago and 8 percent below June 1, 1984. This is the lowest June 1 inventory since 1975.

- Breeding inventory, at 6.39 million head, is 9 percent below last year and 14 percent below two years ago. This is the lowest June 1 breeding inventory since the establishment of June 1 U.S. inventory estimates in 1964.
- Market hog inventory, at 42.5 million head, is 6 percent below a year ago and 7 percent below two years ago.

The 10 Quarterly States, with 38.0 million head on June 1, 1986, are down 9 percent from both last year and two years ago.

PIG CROP

The December 1985-May 1986 U.S. pig crop was 41.1 million head, 3 percent below last year and two years ago.

Sows farrowing during this 6 month period, at 5.31 million, were 5 percent less than the previous year and 7 percent below two years ago. Pigs saved per litter was a record high 7.73 and compares with 7.64 last year and 7.45 two years ago.

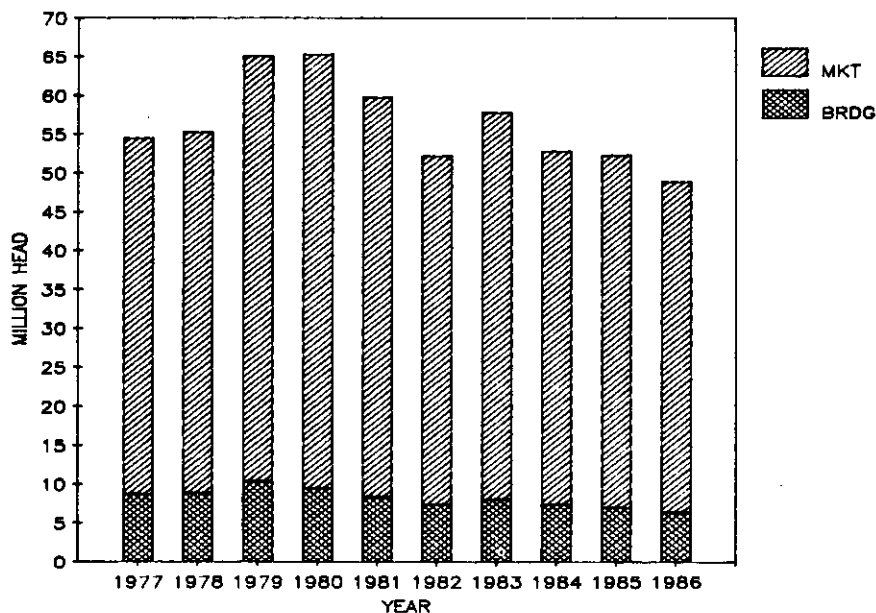
In the 10 Quarterly States, the December-May pig crop was 31.8 million head, 5 percent below last year and 4 percent below two years ago. The December 1985-February 1986 pig crop, at 14.9 million head, was up 1 percent from a year ago and 4 percent from two years ago. The March-May pig crop of 16.9 million head was 10 percent below last year and two years ago.

FARROWING INTENTIONS

U.S. hog producers intend to farrow 5.16 million sows during the June-November period, a decrease of 9 percent from the same period in 1985 and 12 percent below two years ago.

Intentions in the 10 Quarterly States for June-November are 4.06 million head, down 9 percent from the corresponding period last year and 11 percent below two years ago. June-August intended farrowings, at 2.02 million head, are down 8 percent from the comparable quarter in 1985, while September-November intended farrowings, at 2.04 million head, are down 10 percent from last year.

RELIABILITY AND ESTIMATING PROCEDURES: Primary data used in setting these hog estimates were obtained from a sample of farmers across the U.S. using probability surveys. Information was collected by mail, telephone, and personal interviews. Since all operations raising hogs were not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is about two percent at the U.S. level for hog inventory. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that survey estimates will be within four percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording, and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

The sampling variability of survey estimates on intended farrowings is slightly larger than that for inventories. More important, actual farrowings may differ significantly from reported intentions due to unexpected economic and environmental conditions. For June-August second intentions in the 10 quarterly States, these differences have exceeded three percent in two of the last ten years. For September-November first intentions in the 10 quarterly States as of June 1, these differences have exceeded six percent in four of the last ten years.

In setting the inventory estimates, the Agricultural Statistics Board constructed a U.S. balance sheet using estimates on births, deaths, and check data on slaughter, imports, and exports. This balance sheet provided an additional check on survey inventory estimates.

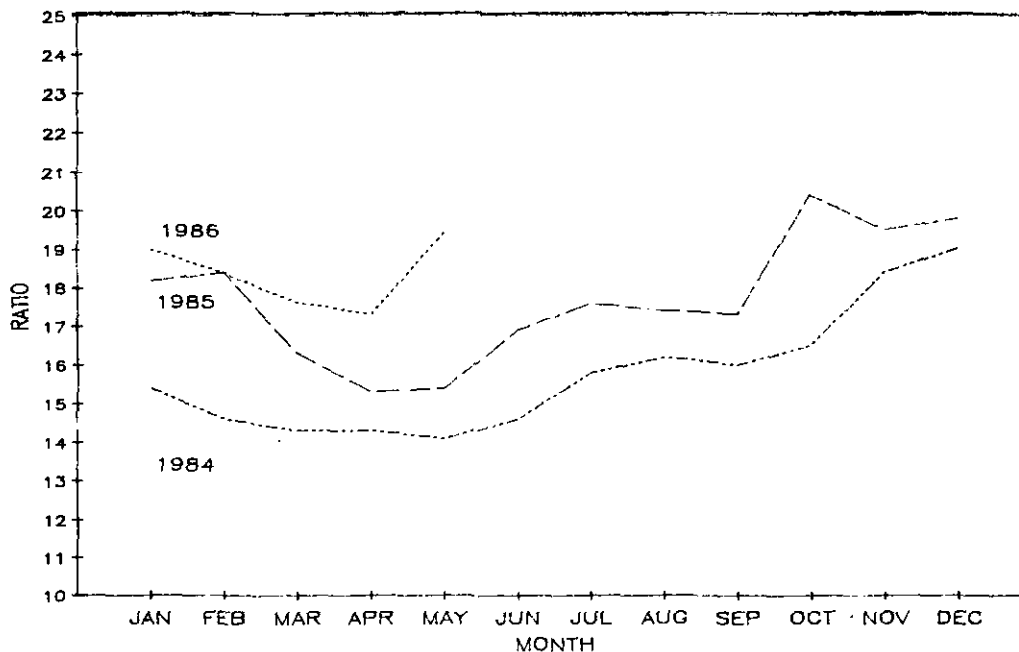
