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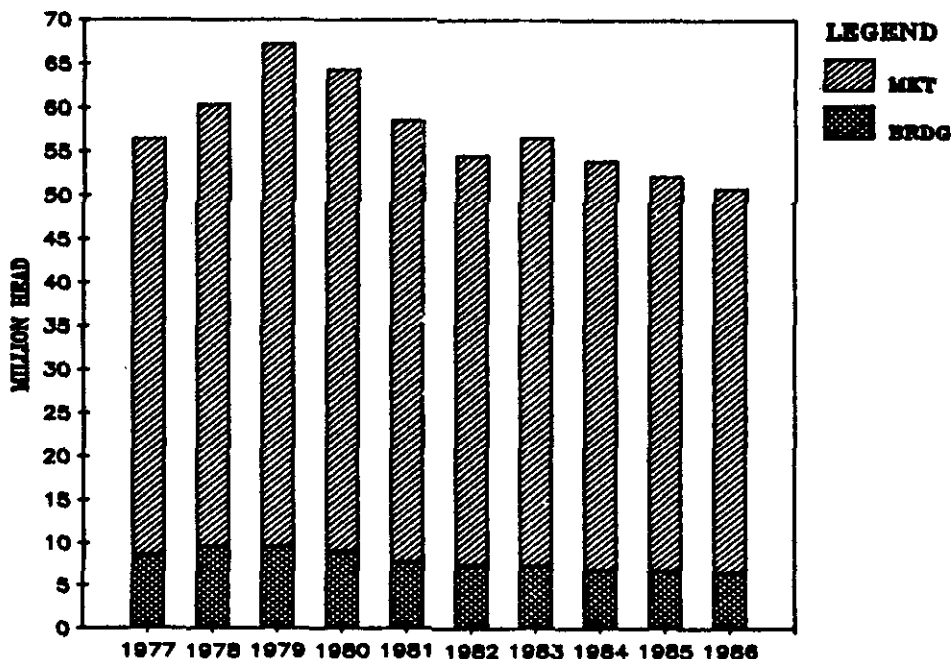
**INVENTORY DOWN 3 PERCENT:** U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs is estimated at 51.0 million head on December 1, 1986, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. This is 3 percent below a year ago, 6 percent less than December 1, 1984 and the lowest December 1 inventory since 1975.

-- Breeding hog inventory, at 6.61 million, is 3 percent below last year and 5 percent below two years ago. This is the lowest December 1 breeding inventory since breeding inventory estimates were first begun in 1963.

-- Market hog inventory, at 44.3 million, is 3 percent below a year ago and 6 percent below two years ago.

The 10 QUARTERLY STATES with 39.7 million head on December 1, 1986, are down 3 percent from a year earlier and 6 percent from December 1, 1984. These 10 States account for approximately 78 percent of the total U.S. hog and pig inventory.

## DECEMBER 1 ALL HOGS AND PIGS UNITED STATES



1986 PIG CROP: The U.S. pig crop for 1986 totaled 82.3 million head, 4 percent below 1985 and 5 percent below the 1984 pig crop.

-- December 1985-May 1986 pig crop, estimated at 40.3 million head, is down 5 percent from both a year earlier and the comparable period in 1984.

-- June-November 1986 pig crop, estimated at 42.0 million head, is 3 percent below last year, and 5 percent below the June-November 1984 crop.

A total of 5.42 million sows farrowed during June-November 1986, 4 percent below a year earlier and 7 percent below the June-November 1984 period. The litter size during this period averaged a record high 7.74, up from the previous record of 7.67 set a year earlier and up from 7.54 for the June-November 1984 period.

In the 10 QUARTERLY STATES, the June-August 1986 pig crop totaled 15.9 million head, 6 percent below the same quarter a year earlier. For the September-November period, the pig crop of 16.7 million head is 3 percent below the same period in 1985.

FARROWING INTENTIONS: U.S. hog producers intend to have 5.34 million sows farrow during the December 1986-May 1987 period, up 2 percent from a year ago.

Intentions in the 10 QUARTERLY STATES totaled 1.87 million sows to farrow during December 1986-February 1987. This is up fractionally from actual farrowings during the same period a year earlier. The March-May 1987 intentions, at 2.21 million, are 2 percent above the March-May 1986 quarter.

RELIABILITY AND ESTIMATING PROCEDURES: Primary data used in setting these hog estimates were obtained from a sample of farmers across the U.S. using probability surveys. Information was collected by mail, telephone and personal interviews. Since all operations raising hogs were not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is about 2 percent at the U.S. level for hog inventory. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that survey estimates will be within 4 percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers. Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording, and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

The sampling variability of survey estimates on intended farrowings is slightly larger than that for inventories. More important, actual farrowings may differ significantly from reported intentions due to changes in economic and environmental conditions. For second intentions these differences have exceeded 5 percent in 2 of the last 10 quarterly December-February pig crops. For first intentions these differences have exceeded 6 percent in 3 of the last 10 quarterly March-May pig crops.


In setting the inventory estimates, the Agricultural Statistics Board constructed a U.S. balance sheet using estimates on births, deaths and check data on slaughter, imports and exports. The balance sheet provided an additional check on survey inventory estimates.

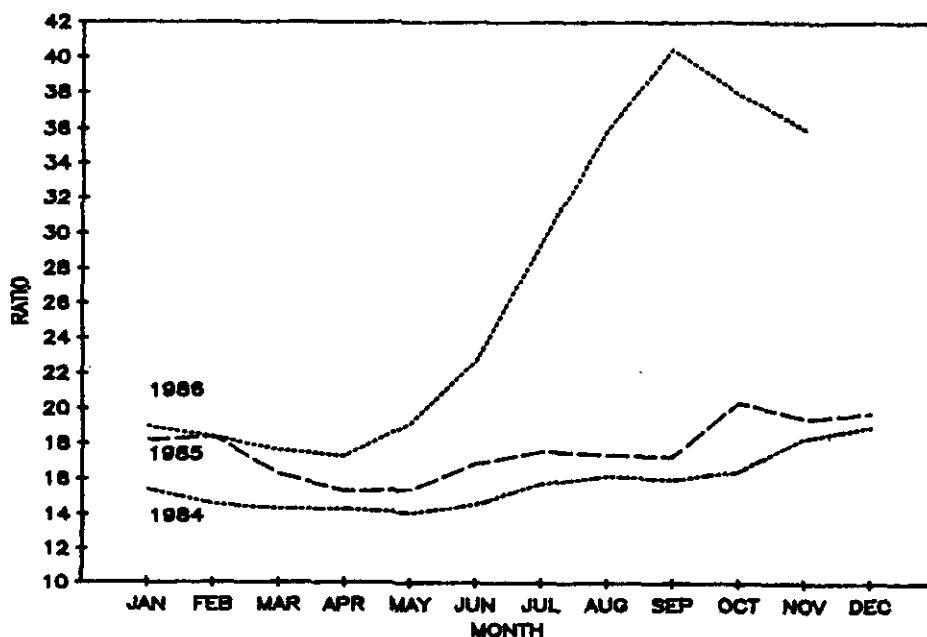
